## Eric Schoh Athletic Director



Entering his fourth year as athletic director, Eric Schoh has injected enthusiasm and success into the Wildcat athletic department.

Wayne State college placed third in the 2006-07 Northern Sun Conference All-Sports Standings by winning four conference championships (women's cross country, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field). Two teams (volleyball and baseball) also qualified for NCAA post-season competition.

"Everyone associated with Wildcat athletics should be proud of our accomplishments this past year," said Schoh. "The student-athletes, coaches, campus community and people of Wayne all had a hand in our success. It is a credit to the quality student-athletes we have at Wayne State when you are able to combine academic accomplishments with athletic success."

Prior to coming to Wayne State, Schoh was the associate athletic director for development at California State University in Bakersfield, California, from 2002-2004. From 1998-2002, Schoh was associate director of athletics at the University of South Dakota. He was the regional director of D.D. Marketing Inc. in Pueblo, Colorado, from 1997-98 and was the assistant director of athletics at Montana State University in Billings, Montana, from 1995-97.

Schoh earned his master's degree in education from Iowa State University. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications from Iowa State University as well.

Schoh is a native of LaCrescent, Minnesota. He and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Paige, Eric and Tyler.

## Mike Barry Associate Athletic Director



Mike Barry is in his ninth year as associate director of athletics. Barry is also in his 10th year as the director of sports and recreational facilities. His duties include scheduling athletic contests and practices, home game management and serving as the athletic and recreational facilities' coordinator.

Barry was the Wayne State women's basketball head coach for seven seasons. He compiled a 97-92 record, which is third all-time on the school's career victory list. His best team was the 1993-94 squad which posted a 22-5 record.

Barry came to Wayne State following two years as an assistant women's basketball coach at Pratt Community College in Kansas. He also coached at Chadron State, Eastern New Mexico State University, and Fullerton and Stuart high schools in Nebraska.

Barry, a native of Grant, Nebraska, was a four-sport athlete at Chadron State. He was a three-time NAIA national qualifier in the triple jump, and also lettered in basketball, football and cross country.

Barry earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Chadron State in 1983 and earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education in 1988. He and his wife, Jeannette, have two sons, Jordan, 14, and Jalen, 11. Barry also has a son Rick, who live in Chadron, Nebraska.





## New for 2008 at the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex



Wayne State College baseball fans will be greeted with a new scoreboard in the 2008 season at the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex. The 10-inning Daktronics scoreboard was installed in the fall of 2007 in right-center field, replacing the previous scoreboard that was positioned behind the left field wall. The new scoreboard, which is just over 11 feet tall, will provide inning-by-inning scores with updated runs, hits and errors and provide fans easier accessibility to view the score of the game.



Another improvement made to the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex in the fall of 2007 was a concrete walkway from the parking lot to the baseball field. The concrete walkway replaces the hard rock path to the baseball field, making it easier for fans and the handicapped to watch Wildcat baseball. A large concrete pad was also poured between the softball and baseball fields and the area between the clubhouses had new sod installed, making the Pete Chapman Complex even more fan-friendly.



## John Manganaro - Head Coach

### John Manganaro Head Coach



John Manganaro begins his 19th season with the WSC baseball program and his 16th season as the head baseball coach. As the Wildcat's skipper Manganaro has amassed a 421-281-1 record. Hard work, tireless recruiting and superb facilities has enabled Manganaro's success.

Since joining the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference nine seasons ago, the Wildcats have gone 147-44 in the conference which includes league championships in 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007 including tournament championships in 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2006. The Wildcats have also made five trips to the Central Region tournament where they finished third in 2001, second in 2004, third in 2005 and fifth in 2006 and 2007. During Manganaro's tenure, there has been 51 All-Conference, 24 All-Region and six All-American players. In 1998 his team received the Louisville Slugger Independents Award for the top independent in the Central Region.

Under Manganaro's guidance, Wildcat teams and players have experienced a great deal of success. Last season the Wildcats were 37-16 overall and hosted the NSIC Tournament for the fourth straight season with a NSIC-best 25-5 league mark. After the conclusion of the season, senior left-hander Travis Mortimore was selected by the Seattle Mariners in the 21st Round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Outfielder Dustin Jones continued his playing career in the Independent Northern League with the Sioux City Explorers. Jones and teammate Scott Bidroski were also selected to the All-American, All-Region and All-Conference teams. First baseman Marc Manganaro was also a member of the All-Region and All-Conference team. Other Wildcats on the All-Conference team included Connor Bramlet, Mike Donohoe, Mitch Herrick, Adam Hoffman, Alex Koch, Adam McGuire, Mortimore and Sean Soderberg. Joe Wendte was tagged NSIC Freshman of the Year.

Academically, Manganaro's players are always making steps to achieve their goals. In the classroom the team's GPA is annually at or above 3.0. "Our program is about working hard on and off the field. The coaches and I nurture a family bond which facilitates winning. And winning is what we plan on doing every year," added Manganaro.

Before taking over as the Wildcats head coach, Manganaro served as an assistant at WSC for three seasons, where he was the hitting instructor, catchers and outfielders coach. During that time the Wildcats were noted as a top independent in the Central Region. From 1975 to 1989 Manganaro enjoyed a great deal of success coaching high school and American Legion baseball in Northeast Nebraska.

Manganaro is building alumni and community support for his program through The Dugout Club, speaking engagements, community service projects and numerous baseball camps. These efforts have paid off with outstanding game attendance and booster support. Manganaro is a native of Omaha, NE where he graduated from Creighton Prep high school. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Sport Management and Master's degree in Sport Administration from Wayne State College. In addition to being head coach, Manganaro also teaches in the Health, Human Performance and Sport Division and is the Outdoor Recreation Facilities supervisor at WSC. Manganaro is married to the former Janice Gardner. Together, they have six children.

## 2008 Assistant Coaches

### Bruce Schlecht Assistant Coach



Bruce Schlecht is entering his 11th year as an assistant coach on the Wildcat coaching staff. He serves as the team's bench coach. Schlecht brings a wealth of experience to the WSC bench. In addition, he was the head coach of the West

Point Legion program for 22 years. During that time, his teams were perennial Class B state title contenders, winning four times.

### Brian Disch Assistant Coach



Brian Disch is in his fourth year with the Wildcat baseball program. He served as a graduate assistant coach the past three seasons. His coaching duties include outfield play, hitting and strength training. In the 2007 season, the Wildcat hitters finished nationally ranked

in scoring (8.7, 11th), batting average (.342, 15th) and slugging percentage (.519, 17th).

While playing for the Wildcats from 2000-2004, his team was conference champions in 2001, 2003, and 2004, had regional appearances in 2001 and 2004, with a regional runner-up in 2004. His team also set a school record for wins in 2001 with 35 and set a new record for wins in 2004 with 44. He was also Academic All-Conference for four years, a member of the 2003 Verizon Academic All-District Team and also All-Conference in 2004. As a player, he also coached the Norfolk American Legion baseball team.

Disch earned his Bachelor's degree in Mathematics and Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction of Mathematics Education from Wayne State College. Brian and his wife Lisa, reside in Norfolk, Nebraska, and have a daughter, Allison.

### Adam Walkenhorst Graduate Assistant Coach



Adam Walkenhorst is in his second year as an assistant coach with the Wildcat baseball team. He serves as the team's pitching coach. In the 2007 campaign, the Wildcat pitchers finished fifth in the

nation in strikeouts per nine innings (8.5) and led the conference in earned run average (4.11).

While playing for the Wildcats from 1998-2001, his team won the school's first NSIC baseball championship in 2001 and also qualified for the Central Region Tournament for the first time. His team also set a school record for wins in 2001 with 35.

Walkenhorst is working on a Master's Degree in Sport Management. Adam resides in Wayne, Nebraska, and has one daughter, Lily (2).

### Ryan Lennerton Student Assistant Coach



Ryan Lennerton is in his first season on the Wayne State College baseball coaching staff and will work with the pitchers. Lennerton spent the 2006 and 2007 season as pitching coach at Galveston College in Galveston, Texas. Prior to that, he served as head coach of the

U16 Langley British Columbia Blaze Team and served as pitching coach of the U18 Langley Blaze of the British Columbia Premier Baseball League.

Lennerton, a native of Langley, British Columbia, played collegiate baseball for Eastern Oklahoma State College for two years before transferring to the University of Arkansas. Playing under Razorbacks head coach Dave Van Horn, Lennerton was a member of Arkansas's 2004 team that reached the College World Series and also captured the 2004 Southeastern Conference Championship. He was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2001 (24th Round) and 2002 (42nd Round).

Lennerton is pursuing a degree in health sciences at Wayne State College.

## 2008 Season Outlook



This year's Wayne State College Wildcat baseball team will try to keep the momentum established by the past five clubs, which included five conference championships and four Central Region Tournament appearances. This hard-working, blue-collar bunch is determined to bring home a sixth consecutive Northern Sun Conference championship and return to the NCAA Central Region tournament for the fifth straight year. The 2008 Wildcats return six starters in the field and four pitchers that logged quality innings last season. Offensively, the Wildcats are expected to continue to hit both for average and power. Defensively, WSC lost only one starter in the infield and two outfielders. The experienced infield has made tremendous improvements defensively from a year ago. With the pitching staff returning three starters and 13 talented newcomers, this staff has the ability to be better than the 2007 staff. In addition to last year's roster, the availability of 2008 redshirts and solid recruits will provide depth to the squad.

### Pitching

Leading the staff will be senior right-hander Nick Schumacher. The 2005 NSIC Pitcher of the Year pitched minimal innings in the 2007 campaign after recovering from

elbow surgery. Joining Schumacher in the rotation are All-Conference senior right-hander Mitch Herrick and sophomore right-hander John Snyder. Herrick was 6-3 last season with a 2.59 ERA, while Snyder went a perfect 7-0 with 54 strikeouts in 51.0 innings pitched. Shoring up relief duties will be junior right-hander Jim Sake, who posted a team-best 2.25 ERA with 19 strikeouts in 16 appearances last season. Senior right-hander Kyle Redmond will also see time out of the bullpen. Junior college transfers Eric Dye, Tyler Gutierrez, Jared Hegdahl, Jeff McDonald, Chad Moreland and Josh Yost all possess ability to contribute either in the starting rotation or as relievers. Alex DeLaet, Justin Kelly and Reid Lancaster are true freshman that will be asked to contribute to the staff during the 2008 season. Redshirting this season and providing depth in the Wildcat pitching staff in the future will be John Bothwell, Tom Doran, Matt Hilligas and Josh Voth.

The returning pitching staff brings experience and dedication. Schumacher is an experienced hard throwing right-hander with an excellent fastball, cutter and changeup. Herrick has great poise on the mound and can spot his fastball and change speeds very well. Snyder is a big, hard throwing right-hander with an excellent fastball and good slider. Sake drops down from the right side to give hitters a different look and has very good movement.

Newcomer right-handers Dye, Gutierrez, Hegdahl, McDonald, Moreland and Yost are very talented hard throwing pitchers that are expected to see innings as starters and out of the bullpen. Coach Manganaro feels assured this staff will be a big part of the 2008 successes, "These pitchers have worked extremely hard preparing for the 2008 season and are in tremendous physical shape. I have no doubt they will give our team an opportunity to win."



## 2008 Season Outlook

### Catching

The catching position will be a battled position between senior Jordan Webb, sophomore Darren Kamp and freshman Matt Dunn. Webb is an experienced hard working catcher that receives well and has a very good arm while Kamp is very intelligent and swings the bat well. Dunn will be an offensive threat at the plate and has a very good arm behind the dish. All of them will do a great job behind the plate.

### First Base

Senior Marc Manganaro will be the starter at first base this spring. The All-Region selection hit .337 with 20 doubles, four home runs and 54 RBI's as a junior last season. Freshman Treye Hacker will backup Manganaro and will bring a live bat from the left side. Alex Koch and Diego Marquez could also see time at first base during the 2008 campaign.

### Second Base

Brian Sulzman returns for his senior season as the Wildcats starting second baseman. Sulzman played very well at second base last season for the 'Cats and hit .295 with 10 doubles and three home runs. Freshman Nick Bidroski will also see time at second base. Bidroski is recovering from shoulder surgery this fall and can swing it well from the left side of the plate. Freshman Derek Eversole and Travis Parsons will bring depth to the middle infield and will be key players in the Wildcats future.

### Shortstop

Junior college transfer Seth Chadick is a sure gloved defensive specialist who will be the backbone of the Wildcat defense in 2008. The 6'4" transfer from Cloud CC will hit for average and power. Backing up Chadick will be Sulzman and Bidroski.

### Third Base

Senior Diego Marquez and junior Alex Koch will play third base this spring. Marquez hit .328 last season with seven doubles and three home runs. Koch was named to the All-Conference team last season after hitting .321 with 13 doubles, four home runs and 43 RBI's.

### Outfield

There are a group of outfielders that will be battling for positions throughout the spring that should give the Wildcats very good depth in the outfield. Juniors Sean Soderberg and Josh Yost will patrol right field while freshman Mike Bisenius and Chad Corbett will be pushing to get into the starting lineup. Wendte was the 2007 NSIC Freshman of the Year and hit a team-high .417 with six doubles, three triples and three home runs. Soderberg, a 2007 All-Conference selection, was third on the team in hitting at .379. Jake Hunke and Ross Ossino will redshirt this season and will be contributors in the future.

### Designated Hitter

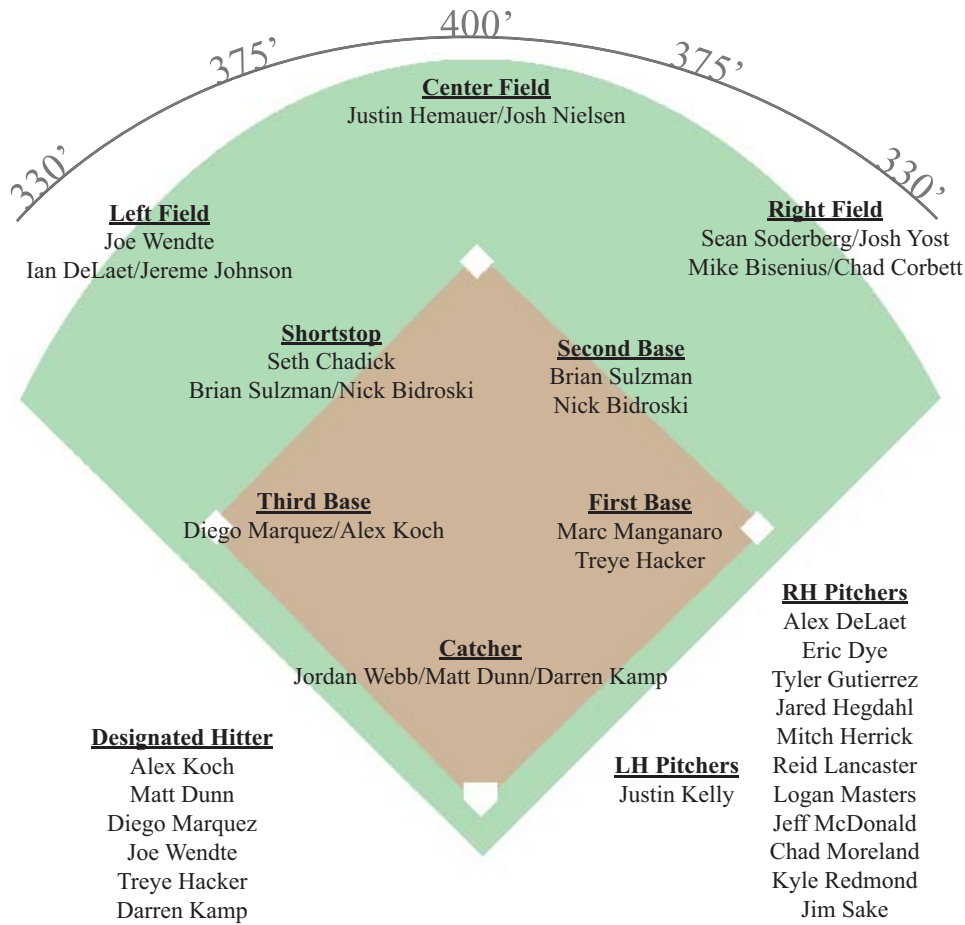

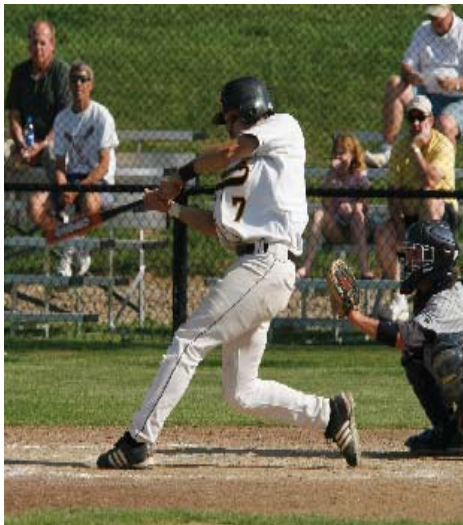

# About the NSIC



The 2005 Wayne State College baseball team broke the school record for wins in a season with 45, going 45-14 overall. The Wildcats won the NSIC and appeared in the Central Regional.



The 2004 Wayne State College baseball team hosted the NSIC Tournament for the first time in school history, going 44-18 overall with a second place finish at the Central Regional.



The 2001 Wayne State College baseball team won the NSIC and appeared at the Central Regional for the first time in school history, finishing the season with a 35-10 record.

Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992 the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Minnesota, Nebraska and South Dakota. In the 1999-00 academic year, the NSIC became an expanded 10-team league from a previous seven-member conference. The league expands back to 10 teams as the University of Mary in Bismarck, N.D., and Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, will start league play in the fall of 2006.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for the 74 years of its existence. The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed following the 2003-04 season, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, while Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston became members in 1999. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks in 2003.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

Following the 2004-05 season, Winona State became the first team other than Minnesota Duluth to capture the NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Warriors have taken home the trophy now the last two seasons. Winona State put the NSIC on the national map in 2006 as they hosted and won the NCAA North Central Regional Tournament and went on to capture the Division II National Championship.

Wayne State College finished third in the 2006-07 NSIC All-Sports Competition. The Wildcats won four conference championships (women's cross country, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field) and sent two teams to NCAA Regional competition. WSC hosted the NCAA North Central Regional Cross Country Championships in 2006 and hosted the 2007 NSIC Baseball Tournament for a fourth straight season.

Over the years, the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."

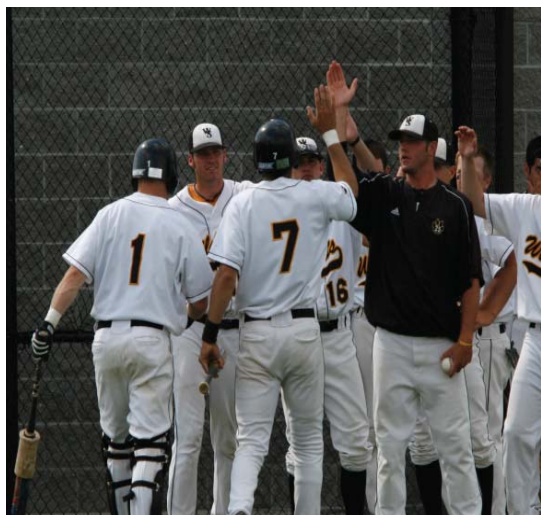
# 2007 Season in Review

The 2007 Wayne State College baseball team had another successful season finishing with a 37-16 overall record and a fifth straight NSIC title. However, the 'Cats did begin the season playing only .500 ball. Through 18 games, Wayne State found themselves with a 9-9 mark which included wins over Pittsburg State, Missouri Western, SIU-Edwardsville, Davis and Elkins, Fairmont State, Nebraska-Kearney, Augustana and Northwest Missouri State. During that span, WSC played at the University of Nebraska where they lost 6-1 at Haymarket Park in Lincoln. The Wildcats also put their backs against the wall early in the conference season by losing their first two games to Upper Iowa. Then the 'Cats rattled off 13 consecutive wins which was one win short of tying the school record. Upper Iowa, Northwest Missouri State, Minnesota, Crookston, Northern State and Southwest Minnesota State all fell victim to Wayne State during the streak. WSC would then win three out of four from the University of Mary, split with Winona State, sweep Concordia-St. Paul, split with Southwest Minnesota State and sweep Bemidji State to win their fifth straight conference title. Wayne State hosted the conference tournament for the fourth straight season and began the tournament with a 35-12 overall record. The 'Cats ran into a red hot Concordia-St. Paul team that just got done winning their final three games against Upper Iowa to sneak into the tournament. The Golden Bears shocked the Wildcats 9-6 to snap Wayne State's 15 game winning streak against CSP. The Wildcats would win their first elimination game over Southwest Minnesota State 20-7 and get revenge over Concordia-St. Paul 10-7 to reach the NSIC Tournament Championship Game for the fifth straight season against Winona State. The Warriors took advantage of a late inning three-run home run to win their first conference tournament championship since 2000. However, the 'Cats were still invited to the NCAA Central Region Tournament in Warrensburg, Missouri, earning a number three seed in the six team regional. Wayne State lost the first game of the tournament to former 2006 Central Region champion Emporia State 6-2 and also their elimination game to the eventual 2007 Central Region champion Nebraska-Omaha 10-3.

The seniors of the 2007 squad left the Wayne State program with a conference championship and regional appearance in each of their years of competition. They also helped the 'Cats become the 13th winningest baseball team of the 21st Century in NCAA Division II with an overall record of 283-129-1 and a winning percentage of .685. The Wildcats had many individual school records and honors during the 2007 season. Dustin Jones holds the school record for single season runs (73), career runs (236), career hits (276) and career triples (16). Scott Bidroski is the leader in career at bats (757) and career RBI's (192). Marc Manganaro tied the school record with 21 hit by pitches and holds the record for putouts in a season with 430. Adam Hoffman has the most sacrifice bunts in a season (19), while John Snyder tied the best winning percentage in a season (7-0, 1.000) and Adam McGuire tied the career saves mark at 10. Both Bidroski and Jones were named to All-American Teams, while Manganaro joined both of them on the All-Region Team. The 'Cats had 12 players on the All-Conference team with Joe Wendte being selected the NSIC Freshman of the Year. Coach Manganaro was also selected the NSIC Coach of the Year for the third time.
