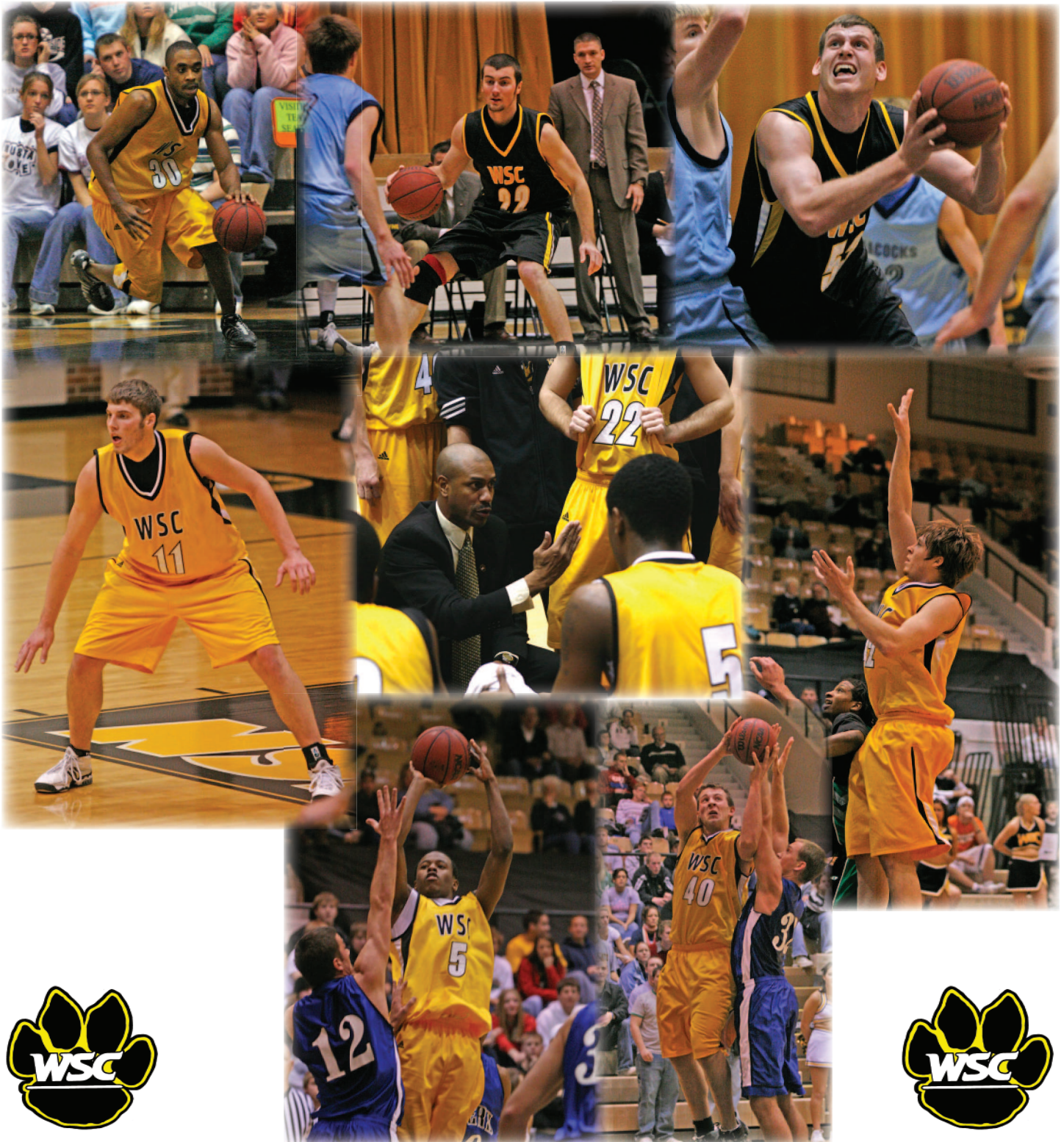

MEDIA INFORMATION



MEDIA GUIDELINES

CREDENTIALS

Requests for press, radio, photography and television credentials should be made one week prior to the game to insure seating along press row. Requests should be directed to the Sports Information Office. Only members of the working media will be issued credentials.

Credentials may be picked up at the will-call window, located in the main entrance to Rice Auditorium, which is on the west side of the building. Credentials must be visible at all times.

RADIO

A visitor's radio table, equipped with a courtesy phone line, is available courtside next to the visitors' bench. Radio stations should contact the Sports Information Office a week before the game to receive broadcast information.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographers must follow all NCAA and WSC regulations concerning access to the sidelines. Photographers are not allowed behind the team benches, but are allowed on the stage.

PARKING

Limited space is available in a reserved parking lot west of Rice Auditorium. Spaces are reserved on a first call basis. Contact the Sports Information Office for parking availability.

WEEKLY INTERVIEWS

WSC coaches and players will be available for interviews Monday through Thursday, except during practices and on game days. Interview requests should be made through the Sports Information Office.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

After a brief "cooling off" period, WSC players and coaches will be available for post-game interviews. Players will be available in the area by the WSC team bench. Coach Burkett will meet with the media in this same area following his radio show. The WSC locker room is off limits to the media. Interview requests with WSC players will be taken toward the end of the game.

STATISTICS

A complete package of pre-game notes and statistics will be available. Halftime statistics will also be provided. Final statistics, including a play-by-play, will be distributed to the interview area approximately 15 minutes after the game.

The Sports Information Office will fax results to any desired media outlet. Fax lists should be submitted two days prior to the game.

Founded in 1891 as Nebraska Normal College, Wayne State College, in Wayne, Neb. earned a distinguished reputation as a teachers' college from its early days. We're still a great teachers' college—but so much more!

Innovative Programs

Wayne State's four academic schools—Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Counseling, and Natural and Social Sciences—offer a comprehensive selection of courses. You'll find over 150 majors and minors ranging from pre-professional studies to criminal justice to a nationally accredited undergraduate sports management program, and many others in 14 academic departments across campus.

The Rural Health Opportunities Program (RHOP) at Wayne State College provides pre-professional training in medicine, pharmacy and dentistry in cooperation with the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Students who successfully complete the program at WSC are automatically accepted into medical, pharmacy, or dental school at UNMC.

Thinking of teaching? Upper-level education majors at Wayne State have the opportunity to participate in the Northeast Nebraska Teacher Academy (NENTA), the first of its kind in the nation, where WSC students receive classroom experience with participating K-12 schools in the region.

Through WSC WebCat On-line, students can register for class and check on grades and student accounts from the convenience of their home or residence hall room.

Excellent Career Preparation

Whether students plan to be accountants or wildlife biologists, they receive the preparation they need at Wayne State College. In addition to classes taught by experts in their fields, Wayne State College provides internship and cooperative programs for students in a number of majors. Many regional businesses actively recruit Wayne State students for internships, with many of these internships resulting in full-time employment after graduation.

The WSC Career Services office assists students with career exploration, job preparation skills, interviews, as well as arranging internships and cooperative experiences.



Personal Attention

Students at Wayne State College don't get lost in the crowd. With an average class size of 21 and a student/faculty ratio of 19:1, WSC students get to know their professors and classmates. Eighty percent of Wayne State professors have the highest degree in their field—and most teach first-year as well as upper-level classes. You will find dedicated professors and instructors at Wayne State College: teaching is their life's work, and their enthusiasm is contagious.

Wayne State College offers a variety of support services and programs to students. The heart of the WSC campus is the Student Center, where academic and personal support services are located. The Learning Center and Peer Tutoring Program are designed to help all students achieve the highest possible level of success in their studies.

Active Campus Life

With more than 90 clubs and organizations on campus, Wayne State College students have many opportunities to be involved in campus and community life.

Wayne State College has an active Greek life, with Greek Olympics being held at Homecoming each fall, as well as other social and service activities. The Student Activities Board (SAB) plans a variety of special programs each year, bringing musical groups such as Three Doors Down, Terri Clark, Vertical Horizon, Five for Fighting, Goo Goo Dolls, Sawyer Brown, Blackhawk, Firehouse, and others to campus. Comedian Adam Sandler and other national performers have performed on campus.

The Multicultural Center, one of the newest campus programs, provides outreach and support to Wayne State College students and the region through special events during the year.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II, and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball and track, cross country, men's baseball, women's softball, men's and women's golf, and women's soccer.

Scenic Surroundings

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Student Center, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall. Ramsey Theatre was recently renovated, with the completion in 2004. A new state-of-the-art indoor track was completed in the summer of 2001 in the WSC Recreation Center.

Wayne State College's seven residence halls provide students with a comfortable, affordable and convenient place to live with easy access to the entire campus community. Each hall has lounges and recreation areas, laundry facilities, mail service, academic tutors and study areas. Six of the seven halls are wired for access to the campus computer network from your personal computer. Smoke-free residence halls are also an option.





WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Richard Collings
President

Dr. Richard Collings is in his fourth year as the 11th president of Wayne State College. Prior to assuming the presidency of Wayne State, Collings was vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of political science and public affairs at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, North Carolina, a position he held from 1996-2004. At Western Carolina, he led many academic and administration initiatives, including creating a residential honors college, developing technology partnerships with other institutions throughout the nation and implementing a strategic planning process.

From 1991-96, Collings was provost and vice president for academic affairs at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, where he had served as dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences from 1989-91. Previously, he was assistant provost and chairperson of the department of political science at Southeast Missouri State in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

A native of Louisville, Ky., Collings earned a Ph.D. in political science in 1977 and a master's degree in Latin American studies in 1972, both from Tulane University. He received a bachelor's degree in international studies from the University of Louisville in 1968.

President Collings and his wife, Marilyn, have three grown children: Michael, Kristen and Kelly. They also have two grandchildren, Ethan and Kai.



Eric Schoh
Director of Athletics

Entering his fourth year as athletic director, Eric Schoh has injected enthusiasm and success into the Wildcat athletic department.

Wayne State College placed third in the 2006-07 Northern Sun Conference All-Sports Standings by winning four conference championships (women's cross country, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field). Two teams, volleyball and baseball, also qualified for NCAA post-season competition.

"Everyone associated with Wildcat athletics should be proud of our accomplishments this past year," said Schoh. "The student-athletes, coaches, campus community and people of Wayne all had a hand in our success. It is a credit to the quality student-athletes we have at Wayne State when you are able to combine academic accomplishments with athletic success."

Prior to coming to Wayne State, Schoh was the associate athletic director for development at California State University in Bakersfield, California, from 2002-2004. From 1998-2002, Schoh was associate director of athletics at the University of South Dakota. He was the regional director of D.D. Marketing Inc. in Pueblo, Colorado, from 1997-98 and was the assistant director of athletics at Montana State University in Billings, Montana, from 1995-97.

Schoh earned his master's degree in education from Iowa State University. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications from Iowa State University as well.

Schoh is a native of LaCrescent, Minnesota. He and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Pagie, Eric and Tyler.



Mike Barry
*Associate Director of Athletics/
Facilities Director*

Mike Barry is in his ninth year as associate director of athletics. Barry is also in his 10th year as the director of sports and recreational facilities. His duties include scheduling athletic contests and practices, home game management and serving as the athletic and recreational facilities' coordinator.

Barry was the Wayne State women's basketball head coach for seven seasons. He compiled a 97-92 record, which is third all-time on the school's career victory list. His best team was the 1993-94 squad which posted a 22-5 record.

Barry came to Wayne State following two years as an assistant women's basketball coach at Pratt Community College in Kansas. He also coached at Chadron State, Eastern New Mexico State University, and Fullerton and Stuart high schools in Nebraska.

Barry, a native of Grant, Nebraska, was four-sport athlete at Chadron State. He was a three-time NAIA national qualifier in the triple jump, and also lettered in basketball, football and cross country.

Barry earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Chadron State in 1983 and earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education in 1988. He and his wife, Jeannette, have two sons, Jordan, 15, and Jalen, 12. Barry also has a son Rick, who live in Crawford, Nebraska.



Dr. Shawn Percy
Faculty Athletic Representative

Dr. Shawn Percy is in his fourth year as Faculty Athletic Representative at Wayne State College. Percy, an associate professor in the Life Sciences Department, is in his 10th year teaching at the school. An Indiana native, he attended Purdue University and Indiana University, earning his bachelors degree from Indiana University in 1989. While an undergraduate, he participated in crew, ultimate and lacrosse.

Percy attended graduate school at Washington State University completing his doctorate in Zoophysiology in 1996. He enjoys teaching general biology, human physiology and vertebrae embryology at WSC. Percy is also a nationally-certified EMT and firefighter and serves on the Wayne Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department.



WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field

Memorial Stadium has been "Home of the Wildcats" since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium following World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box was built at the time of the grandstand construction, with a second level being added in 1969.

The main stadium has seating for 2,500 fans. Bob Cunningham Field has a natural grass surface.



Recreation Center

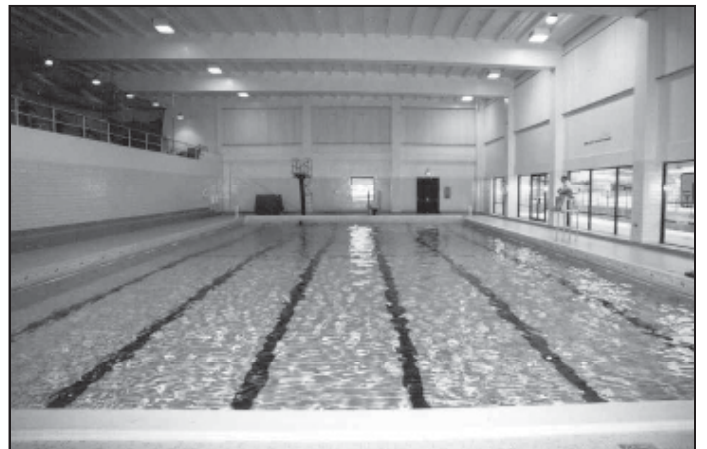
The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987. It is the college's main facility for student recreation and selected athletic activities.

The main area in the Recreation Center provides a six-lane running track and three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis, and badminton. The rec center running track was recently redone with one of the best surfaces in the world. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling, and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff as well as residents of the Wayne community.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams, and offices for the WSC athletic department.

Carlson Natatorium

Carlson Natatorium adjoins the Recreation Center and Rice Auditorium. The 25-yard long pool is used for a variety of functions, including lap swimming, aquasize classes, senior wellness aquasize classes, HHPS classes, intramural activities and athletic training rehabilitation exercises. The natatorium is open in the summer for use by the athletic camps and Rec Center members.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home of the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include: new scoreboards on the north and south walls (summer of 1998); new bleachers in the lower level and a coat of paint (summer of 1996); and a new sound system (spring of 1995). Its facilities include refurbished locker rooms, classrooms, a training room, and a state-of-the-art training facility.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships.

Strength Training Complex

The Wayne State College Varsity Weight Room is located in Rice Auditorium. The strength and conditioning facilities have been carefully designed to maximize workout efficiency and effectiveness, and are furnished with newly purchased state-of-the-art equipment that complements the existing equipment. Also included are three Olympic/power lifting platforms, a large dumbbell area with adjustable benches, dumbbells and a full range of various sized plyometric boxes. Additionally, there are six power squat cages with adjustable benches to allow each station to be a self-contained power area. Each station allows an athlete to squat, bench press, incline bench press, power clean, and push press. Completing the list of equipment are jump ropes, Power Wheels, and a matted area for stretching and abdominal work.



Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex

The Pete Chapman baseball/softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. Located north of Memorial Stadium, the complex provides a picturesque setting for baseball and softball games. The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and a press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season.

In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor of the late athletic director/foot-

ball coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, a locker room/press box was built for the softball field while a new 10-inning scoreboard was installed on the baseball field in the fall of 2007.

Soccer Field

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the baseball field, the WSC soccer field made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. In 2001, a new scoreboard was put in place along with more grandstands to accommodate the growing population of soccer fans attending games.



ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES



TJ Horton *Head Clinic Director*



TJ Horton is in his second year at Wayne State College and first as head athletic trainer after serving in an assistant athletic trainer role in 2006-07. He will oversee athletic training responsibilities for all 15 varsity sports at WSC.

Before coming to Wayne State, the Deerfield, Kansas native worked at Carson-Newman College in Tennessee, an NCAA Division II school. His responsibilities included working with the men's and women's soccer and baseball teams along with teaching introduction to athletic training. Horton also served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at Creighton University in Omaha while working on his masters degree at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. At Creighton, Horton worked with women's soccer, softball and men's and women's tennis.

Horton earned his bachelors degree from the University of Tulsa in 2003 and his masters degree from UNO in 2005.

HEAD COACH RICO BURKETT



Head coach Rico Burkett

Rico Burkett enters his eighth year as the head men's basketball coach for the Wildcats. Burkett guided the Wildcats to an 15-13 overall record in the 2006-07 season, Wayne State's first winning record since 1999-2000. The 'Cats finished in fifth place in the Northern Sun Conference with a 10-8 league mark. His overall mark at WSC is 84-109, including a 58-58 record against Northern Sun Conference schools.

Burkett was named the 22nd head men's basketball coach in Wayne State College history on April 7, 2000. He took over a team he helped mold into one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs in the nation. In Burkett's four seasons as assistant coach, the Wildcats won 90 games, the most wins during any four-year period in school history, and two consecutive NCAA Division II national tournament appearances.

During his rookie season, he directed the Wildcats to a 15-15 overall record, and a 12-6 third-place finish in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. The competitive Wildcat leader looks to continue the success that has been established in his past.

In 1999-2000 with Burkett as an assistant coach, the Wildcats finished the season 26-6 and ranked 19th in the NABC/Division II Bulletin Top 25 poll. That season they won the NSIC regular and postseason titles and went on to compete in the regional tournament in Denver, Colo. There, the Wildcats were eliminated in the championship game by the eventual national champion Metropolitan State College of Denver, by a score of 84-72.

As the Wildcats' assistant, Burkett was involved in all phases of the program, with a special emphasis on working with the perimeter players. He developed, organized and maintained the current WSC recruiting system and worked closely with the summer basketball camps. Burkett also was the academic coordinator for all basketball student-athletes.

Burkett came to WSC from the University of North Dakota in 1994, where he was the assistant coach with the nationally-prominent North Dakota women's basketball team. Serving as the assistant coach during the 1994-95 season, Burkett returned to WSC in 1996, after spending two years at Stetson University in DeLand, Fla.

A standout point-guard for the University of North Dakota's men's basketball program, Burkett lettered for the Fighting Sioux from 1989-91. As a senior, he was named the North Central Conference Defensive Player of the Year. As a junior, he set the UND single-season assists (232) and steals (75) records. In his two-year career, Burkett dished out 401 assists, which broke the UND career record. He currently is third on the Fighting Sioux all-time assists chart.

Burkett was a key figure in the resurgence of the North Dakota program. In his two-year UND career, the Fighting Sioux posted a 57-11 record. UND won two NCC conference titles and two trips to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight, finishing third in 1989-90.

Before attending North Dakota, Burkett played two seasons at Iowa Central Community College, where he helped the Tritons to a regional title and a berth in the national tournament in 1988-89.

Burkett, a native of Des Moines, Iowa, graduated from UND in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in physical education/secondary education. He earned his associate of arts degree from ICCA in 1989.

Rico and his wife, Mandy, have one daughter, Taryn (4) and newborn son Marcus, and they reside in Wayne, Neb.

Matt Murken Assistant Coach

Matt Murken begins his fifth season with the Wildcats. He is the Wildcat post player coach and serves as the recruiting coordinator, camp coordinator, academic coordinator and organizes off-season individual workouts. He was a graduate assistant coach in 2003-04 and moved up to full-time assistant in the 2004-05 season. As a graduate assistant at Wayne State he was in charge

of perimeter players, tape exchange and assisted in all aspects of recruiting. Murken comes to Wayne State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Mount Mercy College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. While at Mount Mercy, Murken helped the Mustangs to a 34-25 record over two seasons and a national ranking both years. He controlled the perimeter players in addition to recruiting and conditioning programs.

Murken got his start at Cedar Rapids Xavier High School in Iowa where he served as an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach. He was a member of the Saints staff for one season. During his time in Cedar Rapids, he also taught full time at Trinity Lutheran School.

Murken, a graduate of Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska, played shooting guard during his collegiate career. During his playing career, the Bulldogs had three, 18+ win seasons and three trips to the NAIA national tournament. He was also named to the NAIA Academic All-American team twice.

A native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Murken attended Prairie High School where he was a two year starter. He was a member of the 1994 team which made the school's first state tournament appearance.

Murken earned his master's degree in sports management at Wayne State College in May, 2006 and resides in Wayne.

2007-2008 WILDCAT OUTLOOK



After finishing 15-13 last season, the Wayne State College men's basketball team looks for continued improvement in 2007-08 with the combination of experienced veterans and talented underclassmen. The Wildcats lose just one starter and two seniors from last year's club that gave WSC its first winning season since the 1999-2000 season. Depth and experience should be two key factors in the success of the Wildcats this season with seven top returning scorers back from last year's team combined with three redshirt freshmen and a stellar recruiting class with another four true freshmen.

"I expect we will be able to play 10-11 guys on any given night," said WSC head coach Rico Burkett, who enters his eighth season at WSC with a 84-109 record. "Our returning players have made tremendous progress during the off-season and our new players have done a great job in our pre-season conditioning and individual workouts."

A pair of seniors who are returning All-NSIC performers will be called on to carry the load this season for the Wildcats. 5-11 guard Bryce Caldwell, a graduate of Davenport North HS in Iowa, averaged 14.3 points and 3.8 rebounds per game last season to earn Second Team All-NSIC honors. His 99 three-pointers were the second most in a single season and Caldwell ranks tied for fourth entering this season in career treys with 183. 6-8 center Matt Rathje (raw-chee) is coming off a career-year, averaging 12.2 points and 7.4 rebounds per game to collect Third Team All-NSIC honors. He led the NSIC in field goal percentage last season at 66.2 percent, making 137 of his 207 shots.

"Bryce has a scorer's mentality and he has the ability to get hot and carry a team for stretches with his shooting ability," said Burkett. "Matt had a great junior year and finished the season playing his best basketball. He has the physical tools to dominate his position on both ends of the floor," remarked Burkett.

The third senior on the team this season is 6-8 center/power forward Eric Johnson from Newell-Fonda HS in Iowa, who led the team in blocks last season with 20 while averaging 1.0 points and 2.0 rebounds per game off the bench. "Eric showed signs of improvement last season providing energy and rebounding," commented Coach Burkett on Johnson. "EJ has had a solid pre-season and seems to be a more consistent and focused player."

Juniors Jonathon Thomas and David Walters will provide plenty of help for Caldwell and Rathje as both players started all 28 games last season as sophomores. Thomas, a 6-6 forward from Maquoketa Valley HS in Iowa, averaged 8.5 points and 6.8 rebounds per game while shooting 55.7 percent from the field. Walters, a 6-2 junior guard from Conrad, Iowa, averaged 7.6 points and 2.1 rebounds per game.

Sophomores Jamar Diggs and Brian Metz gained valuable experience last season and will give the Wildcats two more scoring threats. Diggs, a 6-2 sophomore guard from



Minneapolis DeLasalle HS, was the NSIC Co-Newcomer of the Year last season after averaging 10 points and 2.9 rebounds per game as a backup point guard last season.

Metz, a 6-8 forward/center, averaged 2.4 points and 1.8 rebounds per game last season and has added significant size over the summer and is expected to provide quality backup minutes at the center and power forward position this season.

Three redshirt freshmen will be called upon to provide depth to the returning starters and letter winners from last season. Guards Blake McGriff (New Sharon, Iowa) and Ryan Rudloff (Newman Grove) along with center Sean Thurston (Minneapolis Patrick Henry HS) will battle for playing time after sitting out last season to learn the Wildcat system and add strength.

Four incoming freshmen are expected to make immediate impacts this season, giving the Wildcats plenty of scoring options off the bench. They include 6-7 guard/forward Marcus Messersmith of Winside, a Class D-1 All-Stater last season who averaged 25.4 points and 7.0 rebounds per game; Elijah Miller from Galva-Holstein HS in Iowa, a 6-2 guard who averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds a contest; Nate Trueblood, a 6-5 freshman forward from Dixon, Illinois averaging 15.5 points and 6 rebounds last season and Zane Abner, a 6-5 guard/forward from Atkinson, Nebraska who averaged 18.8 points and 9.1 rebounds for West Holt HS.

"The nucleus is there for a successful season," added Burkett. "A lot will come down to staying healthy, playing together and competing to our maximum potential every time we take the floor. With a consistent effort on defense and rebounding the ball, we can become a very good basketball team."

Wayne State faces another rigorous schedule in the 2007-08 season, playing non-conference games against Nebraska-Kearney and Chadron State from the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, St. Cloud State and Augustana from the North Central Conference plus a road trip to California where the Wildcats face Biola University and Cal-San Diego. The Northern Sun Conference schedule will be as tough as ever with perennial powers Winona State, last year's NCAA Division II runner up, and Northern State. "Winona State and Northern State will again be the teams to beat in the NSIC with both teams bringing back a significant core of veteran players," stated Burkett. "Southwest Minnesota State, MSU Moorhead and Concordia-St. Paul will also return a solid group that could surprise."

Wayne State opens the 2007-08 season at home on Thursday, November 15 facing York College at 7:00 p.m. followed by a 4:00 p.m. home game the next day against Chadron State. The Wildcats open NSIC play on November 30 and December 1 with road games at Minnesota, Crookston and Bemidji State.

THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992 the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North and South Dakota. In the 1999-00 academic year, the NSIC became an expanded 10-team league from a previous seven-member conference. The conference featured eight members from 2004-05 until 2005-06 but the league expanded back to 10 teams in 2006-07 as the University of Mary in Bismarck, N.D., and Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, joined the league.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for the 74 years of its existence. The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed following the 2003-04 season, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston in 1999 and the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks in 2003.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

Following the 2004-05 season, Winona State became the first team other than Minnesota Duluth to capture the NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Warriors have taken home the trophy now the last two seasons. The Warriors put the NSIC on the map in 2006 as they hosted and won the NCAA North Central Regional Tournament and advanced to the Elite Eight. Although Winona State wasn't the first men's basketball team to compete in the Elite Eight (SW Minnesota State in 2001 & Northern State in 1998), they were the first to win it. The National Championship for Winona State marked the first NCAA Title for any NSIC institution.

Since 2000, the NSIC has participated in the only officially-sanctioned NCAA Division II football bowl game in the country. With a rich history dating back to 1948, the Mineral Water Bowl is hosted by the Quarterback Club of Excelsior Springs., Mo. The game matches the highest-finishing team from the NSIC not selected for the NCAA Division II playoffs against the highest-finishing team from the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) not participating in the NCAA Division II playoffs. Now in its 42nd year, the first game was played on Thanksgiving Day, 1948. The first MIAA/NSIC meeting in 2000 marked the Mineral Water Bowl's inaugural year of the Division II era. Winona State defeated Missouri Western State, 43-41, in triple overtime, marking the Warriors first-ever postseason win at the Division II level.

The league gears up for the upcoming academic year with the annual NSIC Summer Kickoff Event the last weekend in July. The event includes the NSIC Golf Tournament, Hall of Fame Banquet, officiating clinics and meetings involving the conference leadership.

The Northern Sun Showcase television program returns to the airwaves again on Fox Sports Net North. Also, the Northern Sun Spotlight radio show will air on several stations throughout the Midwest for 20 weeks during 2007-08 sports season.

Over the years, the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."
