# MEDIA INFORMATION



## **MEDIA GUIDELINES**

### CREDENTIALS

Requests for press, radio, photography and television credentials should be made one week prior to the game to insure seating along press row. Requests should be directed to the Sports Information Office. Only members of the working media will be issued credentials.

Credentials may be picked up at the will-call window, located in the main entrance to Rice Auditorium, which is on the west side of the building. Credentials must be visible at all times.

### RADIO

A visitor's radio table, equipped with a courtesy phone line, is available courtside next to the visitors' bench. Radio stations should contact the Sports Information Office a week before the game to receive broadcast information.

### PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographers must follow all NCAA and WSC regulations concerning access to the sidelines. Photographers are not allowed behind the team benches, but are allowed on the stage.

### PARKING

Limited space is available in a reserved parking lot west of Rice Auditorium. Spaces are reserved on a first call basis. Contact the Sports Information Office for parking availability.

### WEEKLY INTERVIEWS

WSC coaches and players will be available for interviews Monday through Thursday, except during practices and on game days. Interview requests should be made through the Sports Information Office.

### POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

After a brief "cooling off" period, WSC players and coaches will be available for post-game interviews. Players will be available in the area by the WSC team bench. Coach Burkett will meet with the media in this same area following his radio show. The WSC locker room is off limits to the media. Interview requests with WSC players will be taken toward the end of the game.

### STATISTICS

A complete package of pre-game notes and statistics will be available. Halftime statistics will also be provided. Final statistics, including a play-by-play, will be distributed to the interview area approximately 15 minutes after the game.

The Sports Information Office will fax results to any desired media outlet. Fax lists should be submitted two days prior to the game.

## **Innovative Programs**

Wayne State's four academic schools—Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Counseling, and Natural and Social Sciences—offer a comprehensive selection of courses. You'll find over 150 majors and minors ranging from pre-professional studies to criminal justice to a nationally accredited undergraduate sports management program, and many others in 14 academic departments across campus.

The Rural Health Opportunities Program (RHOP) at Wayne State College provides pre-professional training in medicine, pharmacy and dentistry in cooperation with the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Students who successfully complete the program at WSC are automatically accepted into medical, pharmacy, or dental school at UNMC.

Thinking of teaching? Upper-level education majors at Wayne State have the opportunity to participate in the Northeast Nebraska Teacher Academy (NENTA), the first of its kind in the nation, where WSC students receive classroom experience with participating K-12 schools in the region.

Through WSC WebCat On-line, students can register for class and check on grades and student accounts from the convenience of their home or residence hall room.

## **Excellent Career Preparation**

Whether students plan to be accountants or wildlife biologists, they receive the preparation they need at Wayne State College. In addition to classes taught by experts in their fields, Wayne State College provides internship and cooperative programs for students in a number of majors. Many regional businesses actively recruit Wayne State students for internships, with many of these internships resulting in full-time employment after graduation.

The WSC Career Services office assists students with career exploration, job preparation skills, interviews, as well as arranging internships and cooperative experiences.



## **Personal Attention**

Students at Wayne State College don't get lost in the crowd. With an average class size of 21 and a student/faculty ratio of 19:1, WSC students get to know their professors and classmates. Eighty percent of Wayne State professors have the highest degree in their field—and most teach first-year as well as upper-level classes. You will find dedicated professors and instructors at Wayne State College: teaching is their life's work, and their enthusiasm is contagious.

Wayne State College offers a variety of support services and programs to students. The heart of the WSC campus is the Student Center, where academic and personal support services are located. The Learning Center and Peer Tutoring Program are designed to help all students achieve the highest possible level of success in their studies.

## **Active Campus Life**

With more than 90 clubs and organizations on campus, Wayne State College students have many opportunities to be involved in campus and community life.

Wayne State College has an active Greek life, with Greek Olympics being held at Homecoming each fall, as well as other social and service activities. The Student Activities Board (SAB) plans a variety of special programs each year, bringing musical groups such as Three Doors Down, Terri Clark, Vertical Horizon, Five for Fighting, Goo Goo Dolls, Sawyer Brown, Blackhawk, Firehouse, Jason Aldean and others to campus. Co-median Adam Sandler and other national performers have also performed on campus.

The Multicultural Center, one of the newest campus programs, provides outreach and support to Wayne State College students and the region through special events during the year.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball and track, cross country, men's baseball, women's softball, men's and women's golf, and women's soccer.

## **Scenic Surroundings**

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Student Center, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall. Ramsey Theatre was recently renovated, with the completion in 2004. A new state-of-the-art indoor track was completed in the summer of 2001 in the WSC Recreation Center.

# WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



**Dr. Richard Collings**  
*President*

Dr. Richard Collings is in his fifth year as the 11th president of Wayne State College. Prior to assuming the presidency of Wayne State, Collings was vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of political science and public affairs at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, North Carolina, a position he held from 1996-2004. At Western Carolina, he led many academic and administration initiatives, including creating a residential honors college, developing technology partnerships with other institutions throughout the nation and implementing a strategic planning process.

From 1991-96, Collings was provost and vice president for academic affairs at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, where he had served as dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences from 1989-91. Previously, he was assistant provost and chairperson of the department of political science at Southeast Missouri State in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

A native of Louisville, Ky., Collings earned a Ph.D. in political science in 1977 and a master's degree in Latin American studies in 1972, both from Tulane University. He received a bachelor's degree in international studies from the University of Louisville in 1968.

President Collings and his wife, Marilyn, have three grown children: Michael, Kristen and Kelly. They also have four grandchildren, Ethan, Kai, Noah and Olivia.



**Eric Schoh**  
*Director of Athletics*

Entering his fifth year as athletic director, Eric Schoh has injected enthusiasm and success into the Wildcat athletic department.

Wayne State College placed second in the 2007-08 Northern Sun Conference All-Sports Standings by winning two conference championships (baseball and men's outdoor track and field). 11 of the school's 15 sports finished in the top three in their respective sport in the NSIC while three teams (volleyball, women's basketball and baseball) also qualified for NCAA post-season competition.

"Everyone associated with Wildcat athletics should be proud of our accomplishments this past year," said Schoh. "The student-athletes, coaches, campus community and people of Wayne all had a hand in our success. It is a credit to the quality student-athletes we have at Wayne State when you are able to combine academic accomplishments with athletic success."

Prior to coming to Wayne State, Schoh was the associate athletic director for development at California State University in Bakersfield, California, from 2002-2004. From 1998-2002, Schoh was associate director of athletics at the University of South Dakota. He was the regional director of D.D. Marketing Inc. in Pueblo, Colorado, from 1997-98 and was the assistant director of athletics at Montana State University in Billings, Montana, from 1995-97.

Schoh earned his master's degree in education from Iowa State University. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications from Iowa State University as well.

Schoh is a native of LaCrescent, Minnesota. He and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Pagie, Eric and Tyler.



**Mike Barry**  
*Associate Director of Athletics/  
Facilities Director*

Mike Barry is in his ninth year as associate director of athletics. Barry is also in his 11th year as the director of sports and recreational facilities. His duties include scheduling athletic contests and practices, home game management and serving as the athletic and recreational facilities' coordinator.

Barry was the Wayne State women's basketball head coach for seven seasons. He compiled a 97-92 record, which is third all-time on the school's career victory list. His best team was the 1993-94 squad which posted a 22-5 record.

Barry came to Wayne State following two years as an assistant women's basketball coach at Pratt Community College in Kansas. He also coached at Chadron State, Eastern New Mexico State University, and Fullerton and Stuart high schools in Nebraska.

Barry, a native of Grant, Nebraska, was four-sport athlete at Chadron State. He was a three-time NAIA national qualifier in the triple jump, and also lettered in basketball, football and cross country.

Barry earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Chadron State in 1983 and earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education in 1988. He and his wife, Jeannette, have two sons, Jordan, 16, and Jalen, 13. Barry also has a son Rick, who lives in Crawford, Nebraska.



**Dr. Shawn Percy**  
*Faculty Athletic Representative*

Dr. Shawn Percy is in his fifth year as Faculty Athletic Representative at Wayne State College. Percy, an associate professor in the Life Sciences Department, is in his 10th year teaching at the school. An Indiana native, he attended Purdue University and Indiana University, earning his bachelors degree from Indiana University in 1989. While an undergraduate, he participated in crew, ultimate and lacrosse.

Percy attended graduate school at Washington State University completing his doctorate in Zoophysiology in 1996. He enjoys teaching general biology, human physiology and vertebrae embryology at WSC. Percy is also a nationally-certified EMT and firefighter and serves on the Wayne Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department.



# WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



## **Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field**

Memorial Stadium has been "Home of the Wildcats" since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium following World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box was built at the time of the grandstand construction with a second level being added in 1969.

The main stadium has seating for 2,500 fans while the bleachers on the east side of the field can seat an additional 750 fans. Bob Cunningham Field has a natural grass surface.



## **Recreation Center**

The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987. It is the college's main facility for student recreation and selected athletic activities.

The main area in the Recreation Center provides a six-lane running track that was resurfaced in 2001 and has three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis, and badminton. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling, and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff as well as residents of the Wayne community.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams and offices for the WSC athletic department.

## **Carlson Natatorium**

Carlson Natatorium adjoins the Recreation Center and Rice Auditorium. The 25-yard long pool is used for a variety of functions, including lap swimming, aquasize classes, senior wellness aquasize classes, HHPS classes, intramural activities and athletic training rehabilitation exercises. The natatorium is open in the summer for use by the athletic camps and Rec Center members.





# WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



## **Rice Auditorium**

Rice Auditorium serves as the home of the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include: new balcony seats and a new stage curtain in the summer of 2007; a new playing surface in 2004; new scoreboards on the north and south walls (summer of 1998); new bleachers in the lower level and a coat of paint (summer of 1996); and a new sound system (spring of 1995). Its facilities include refurbished locker rooms, classrooms, a training room, and a state-of-the-art training facility.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships and the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic.

## **Strength Training Complex**

The Wayne State College Varsity Weight Room is located in Rice Auditorium. The strength and conditioning facilities have been carefully designed to maximize workout efficiency and effectiveness, and are furnished with newly purchased state-of-the-art equipment that complements the existing equipment. Also included are three Olympic/power lifting platforms, a large dumbbell area with adjustable benches, dumbbells and a full range of various sized plyometric boxes. Additionally, there are six power squat cages with adjustable benches to allow each station to be a self-contained power area. Each station allows an athlete to squat, bench press, incline bench press, power clean, and push press. Completing the list of equipment are jump ropes, Power Wheels, and a matted area for stretching and abdominal work.



## **Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex**

The Pete Chapman baseball/softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. Located north of Memorial Stadium, the complex provides a picturesque setting for baseball and softball games. The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and a press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season.

In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor of the late athletic director/foot-

ball coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, a locker room/press box was built for the softball field while a new 10-inning scoreboard was installed on the baseball field in the fall of 2007.

## **Soccer Field**

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the baseball field, the WSC soccer field made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. In 2001, a new scoreboard was put in place along with more grandstands to accommodate the growing population of soccer fans attending games.



# LOCKER ROOM RENOVATIONS



The Wayne State College athletic department continues to raise the bar for excellence, on and off the field and court. The Wildcat athletic department staff, recognizing the importance of first-class facilities for their student-athletes, is excited about the upcoming, state-of-the-art renovation of the Memorial Football Stadium and Rice Auditorium. This \$4.5 million project will provide a new athletic weight room, five new locker rooms, expanded classrooms and new office space for football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball. This project began in December of 2007 and is expected to be completed this fall.

The new facilities will combine the history and tradition of Wildcat athletics with the latest in innovative technology. The goal is to provide WSC student athletes and coaches with a comfortable, user-friendly space specially designed for maximum productivity. The Memorial Stadium project includes a complete renovation underneath the football grandstand with the addition of a varsity weight room, locker rooms for football and soccer, and football staff offices. Locker rooms will be equipped with custom-built wood lockers.

Complete renovation of the Rice Auditorium basketball locker rooms are included in the plans. Both the men's and women's basketball locker rooms will be expanded, with volleyball gaining its own locker room for the first time in Wildcat history.

"We've needed locker room improvements in Rice for a long, long time and to see it happening is awesome," Schoh remarked.

All of the Rice locker rooms will be equipped with custom-built wood lockers. The Wayne State College Alumni/Friends Locker Legacy campaign will fund a significant portion of the locker project. The campaign's goal is to raise at least \$100,000 through private donations, which will be earmarked towards the locker project.

The renovation project, which will be completed this fall, will enhance Wayne State's ability to attract high quality student athletes and provide current team members with resources necessary to compete at the NCAA Division II level. "This is an exciting project for Wildcat Athletics and we couldn't be more pleased," Schoh said.

## **Muffin Morris** *Head Athletic Trainer*



Muffin Morris is in her first year at Wayne State College as the head athletic trainer. She will oversee athletic training responsibilities for 15 varsity sports at Wayne State College.

Before coming to Wayne State, Morris served four years at the University of South Dakota. She served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer and worked with football, softball, swimming/diving, track/cross country and volleyball programs at USD.

The Chariton, Iowa native earned her bachelor's degree from Buena Vista University in athletic training in 2004. Morris then obtained her master's degree from the University of South Dakota in 2006 in health, physical education and recreation and recently earned her doctorate degree in adult/higher education from the University of South Dakota on July 31, 2008.

Morris is serving as the head trainer for the Wildcat football team this fall and resides in Wayne.

The Athletic Training Room is the site of taping, treatment and injury evaluations. It has a variety of up-to-date, quality equipment. A partial inventory of modalities available for athletes include: three whirlpools, RichMar Theratouch 7.7 electrical stimulation machine, RichMar HV-II combination ultrasound/electrical stimulation machine, RichMar portable ultrasound machine, Game-ready intermittent compression machine, Therabath Parafin machine, and Hydrocollator heat pack units.

## **Dr. Steven Stokesbary** *Team Orthopedist*



Dr. Steven Stokesbary enters his seventh season as Wayne State's team orthopedist.

Dr. Stokesbary is a partner in The Center for Neurosciences, Orthopaedics, and Spine Sports Medicine, P.C. (CNOS) in Dakota Dunes, South Dakota. He graduated from the University of Iowa and earned his medical degree also from the University of Iowa College of Medicine,

after which he completed his residency at the University of Missouri Health Services.

Dr. Stokesbary has been practicing for CNOS Sports Medicine for over seven years, which provides athletic training services for over 40 area high schools, colleges and professional organizations.

### **PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center**

The PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center, which opened December 1, 2005, is a 4,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility. The center is located next to the Wayne State College Recreation Center and serves as the hub for therapy and athletic training services.

In August 2007, Providence Physical Therapy and Wayne State College collaborated to provide therapy services at the PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center. This partnership provides the finest in sports rehabilitation, therapy services and athletic training services to Wayne State student-athletes, the campus community and the general public.

Providence Physical Therapy offers physical, occupational and speech therapy services and is staffed by six physical therapists, two physical therapy assistants, two occupational therapists and one speech therapist. Providence Physical Therapy staff also provides aquatic therapy at the Carlson Natatorium.

Dedicated to excellence and quality care, the PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center athletic training staff and Providence Physical Therapy staff is committed to the health and wellness of WSC students, faculty and the Wayne community.





# HEAD COACH RICO BURKETT



**Head coach Rico Burkett**

Rico Burkett is in his ninth year as the head men's basketball coach for the Wildcats. Burkett has directed Wayne State College to a 100-122 overall record (.450) in his eight seasons while posting a 68-66 mark in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. He became the fourth coach in school history to achieve 100 wins as men's basketball coach on March 1, 2008 when the Wildcats edged Concordia-St. Paul 75-72 in overtime in the first round of the NSIC Tournament in St. Paul, Minnesota. Entering his ninth season as head coach, Burkett now becomes the second-longest tenured coach

in the program's history, trailing only Ray Hickman, who coached WSC for 11 seasons from 1927-38.

In the 2007-08 season, WSC finished the season with a 16-13 record under Burkett, going 10-8 in the NSIC to finish league play in a tie for fourth place. The 16 wins were the most by a Wildcat men's basketball squad since the 1999-2000 club (26-6). WSC also accomplished back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 seasons.

Burkett was named the 22nd head men's basketball coach in Wayne State College history on April 7, 2000. He took over a team he helped mold into one of the most successful NCAA Division II programs in the nation. In Burkett's four seasons as assistant coach, the Wildcats won 90 games, the most wins during any four-year period in school history, and two consecutive NCAA Division II national tournament appearances.

In 1999-2000, the Wildcats finished the season 26-6 and ranked 19th in the NABC/Division II Bulletin Top 25 poll. That season they won the NSIC regular and postseason titles and went on to compete in the NCAA regional tournament in Denver, Colo. There, the Wildcats were eliminated in the championship game by the eventual national champion Metropolitan State College of Denver, by a score of 84-72.

As the Wildcats' assistant, Burkett was involved in all phases of the program, with a special emphasis on working with the perimeter players. He developed, organized and maintained the current WSC recruiting system and worked closely with the summer basketball camps. Burkett also was the academic coordinator for all basketball student-athletes.

Burkett came to WSC from the University of North Dakota in 1994, where he was the assistant coach with the nationally-prominent North Dakota women's basketball team. Serving as the assistant coach during the 1994-95 season, Burkett returned to WSC in 1996, after spending two years at Stetson University in DeLand, Fla.

A standout point-guard for the University of North Dakota's men's basketball program, Burkett lettered for the Fighting Sioux from 1989-91. As a senior, he was named the North Central Conference Defensive Player of the Year. As a junior, he set the UND single-season assists (232) and steals (75) records. In his two-year career, Burkett dished out 401 assists, which broke the

UND career record. He currently is third on the Fighting Sioux all-time assists chart.

Burkett was a key figure in the resurgence of the North Dakota program. In his two-year UND career, the Fighting Sioux posted a 57-11 record. UND won two NCC conference titles and two trips to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight, finishing third in 1989-90.

Before attending North Dakota, Burkett, a native of Des Moines, Iowa, played two seasons at Iowa Central Community College, where he helped the Tritons to a regional title and a berth in the national tournament in 1988-89. Burkett earned his associate of arts degree from ICCA in 1989 and graduated from North Dakota in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in physical education/secondary education.

Rico and his wife, Mandy, have two children, daughter Taryn (5) and son Marcus (1), and they reside in Wayne.

## **Matt Murken Assistant Coach**

Matt Murken is in his sixth season with the Wildcats. He is the Wildcat post player coach and serves as the recruiting coordinator, camp coordinator, academic coordinator and organizes off-season individual workouts. He was a graduate assistant coach in 2003-04 and moved up to full-time assistant in the 2004-05 season.

Matt has extensive experience as a coach and clinician at basketball camps and clinics, working more than 50 venues across the United States. In the summer of 2008, Murken added international coaching to his coaching record by touring Kenya with Athletes in Action. The group conducted basketball clinics for coaches from the Kenyan National Team, Kenyan and Ugandan colleges, the Kenyan professional league and area high school teams.

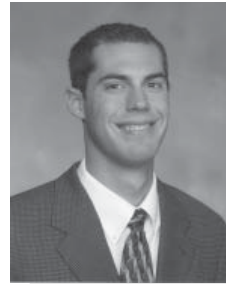
Murken comes to Wayne State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Mount Mercy College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. While at Mount Mercy, Murken helped the Mustangs to a 34-25 record over two seasons and a national ranking both years. He controlled the perimeter players in addition to recruiting and conditioning programs.

Murken got his start at Cedar Rapids Xavier High School in Iowa where he served as an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach. He was a member of the Saints staff for one season. During his time in Cedar Rapids, he also taught full time at Trinity Lutheran School.

Murken, a graduate of Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska, played shooting guard during his collegiate career. During his playing career, the Bulldogs had three, 18+ win seasons and three trips to the NAIA national tournament. He was also named to the NAIA Academic All-American team twice.

A native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Murken attended Prairie High School where he was a two year starter. He was a member of the 1994 team which made the school's first state tournament appearance.

Murken earned his master's degree in sport management at Wayne State College in May, 2006 and resides in Wayne.



## **Scott Hannon Graduate Assistant**

Scott Hannon begins his first season as a graduate assistant coach for the Wayne State College men's basketball program.

The York, Nebraska native is a May, 2008 graduate of Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska where Hannon earned his bachelor's degree in business management after starting his college career at Nebraska-Kearney. In two seasons at Concordia, Hannon was a standout basketball player for the Bulldogs scoring over 1,000 points while earning Second Team All-Great Plains Athletic Conference honors as a junior and senior. During his senior season, Hannon averaged 14.4 points and 5.0 rebounds per game while starting all 30 contests for CU. In his junior season, Hannon produced 18.2 points and 4.7 rebounds per contest. He was also named to the Omaha World Herald All-NAIA Men's Basketball Team as a senior.

Hannon has worked camps at Nebraska, Creighton, Concordia University and York High School. He is pursuing a master's degree at Wayne State College in sport management and resides in Wayne.

# 2008-2009 WILDCAT OUTLOOK



Coming off a 16-13 record last season, the Wayne State College men's basketball team will rely on seven newcomers to go with some returning underclassmen to replace three starters that accounted for 41.8 points and 15.1 rebounds per game last season for the Wildcats. Gone from last season's team are three-year starting guard Bryce Caldwell (15.7 ppg), the school's second-most prolific three point shooter with 294 treys, and starting center Matt Rathje (10.2 points and 6.0 rebounds per game), both lost to graduation, and two-year starting point guard Jamar Diggs, who transferred to Division I Wofford University after averaging 15.9 points and 4.8 assists per game as a sophomore.

The Wildcats return two starters and seven letter winners off last year's team that finished in a tie for fourth place in the Northern Sun Conference with a 10-8 league mark. Coach Burkett will rely on seniors Jonathon Thomas and David Walters, the team's two returning starters, for leadership and experience as the Wildcats look to replace the top three scorers and two of the team's top three rebounders from last season's club.

"We will be deeper than what we have been in the past and that depth should allow us to play a little differently than what we have been," said WSC head coach Rico Burkett, who enters his ninth season at WSC with a 100-122 record. "If we buy into the team first concept, we have some pieces that can surprise a lot of people. We have to go out everyday with the right mentality to get better every day."

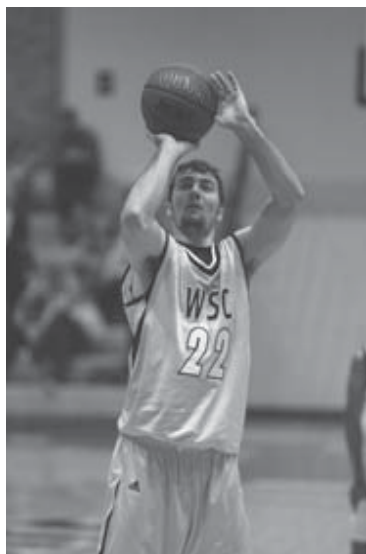
Thomas, a 6-6 senior forward from Earlville, Iowa, overcome early injuries last season to average 9.9 points and a team-high 6.8 rebounds per game (2nd-NSIC) while shooting 50.9 percent from the field. "We need JT to take his game to the next level this season," commented Burkett. "He has had to play more of a complimentary role the last two seasons, but now is his time to step up and be one of our go-to guys this season."

The other returning starter is senior off-guard David Walters of Conrad, Iowa. Last season, he averaged 5.4 points and 2.8 rebounds while starting 28 of 29 games. "David has accepted the role of guarding the toughest offensive perimeter player and we need him to provide that consistency from the perimeter," said Coach Burkett. "We need David to provide some toughness defensively and supply a consistent perimeter threat."

The third senior on the club this season is New Mexico Highlands transfer Billy Delano, a graduate of Bellevue West High School. Delano averaged nine points and four rebounds per game last season for New Mexico Highlands, a member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. "Billy has the ability to score the basketball from both inside and out," stated Burkett. "We will need him to provide toughness inside defensively and on the glass."

Five juniors, one returner and four transfers, will be called upon to contribute immediately. The lone returning junior is 6-8 center Brian Metz, who averaged 3.5 points and 2.2 rebounds per game last season off the bench, shooting a stellar 59.2 percent from the field. "Brian has added some significant size over the summer and is playing with a ton of confidence," Coach Burkett remarked. "He has all the physical tools to be one of the best low-post players in our league this season."

Junior college transfer Brent Jackman, a 6-3 guard from Des Moines Area Community College, averaged 13.5 points, 4.6 rebounds and 3.4 assists per game last season at DMACC, and is expected to be a standout perimeter performer for the Wildcats this season. "Brent can do a lot of things to help make this program better," said Burkett. "He has the ability to be a lock down perimeter defender and we expect "B-Jack" to hit the ground running and



make a big-time contribution."

6-7 forward Brett Spiker, a transfer from Drake University, and guards Cory Humphries and Rashaad Stokelin, both of Pima Community College in Arizona, will be looked upon to provide depth as the other juniors on the Wildcat roster. Humphries averaged 17.7 points per game to earn First Team All-Region honors at Pima last season while Stokelin contributed 14.6 points, 7.3 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game at the same school.

Headlining a group of five sophomores are four players that saw considerable action last season as reserves. They include point guard Ryan Rudloff of Newman Grove, who will compete for significant playing time this season. "He plays extremely hard and really has made a positive impression with our staff and teammates because of his toughness and work ethic."

Blake McGriff, a 6-3 guard, averaged 1.8 points per game off the bench last season

while appearing in all 29 games as a reserve. A pair of sophomores that will play the forward position are returning letter winners Zane Abner and Nate Trueblood. Abner, from Atkinson West HS, averaged 1.7 points per game last season while Trueblood played in all 29 games last season averaging 1.4 points per game in a pair of starts. The final sophomore is transfer Ben Tasa from Humphrey St. Francis High School, who joined the Wildcats this season after spending two years playing football at Nebraska. Tasa earned Class D-1 All State honors in basketball helping Humphrey St. Francis to a 23-3 record and the Class D-1 State Championship in 2006. He will add depth at the power forward position for the Wildcats.

Three freshmen round out the roster for Coach Burkett with redshirts Marcus Messersmith, a 6-7 guard/forward from Winside, Nebraska and Elijah Miller, a 6-2 point guard from Galva-Holstein HS in Iowa. The final freshman is Porter Birtell of Lutheran High Northeast High School, a 6-7 forward/center who averaged 22.2 points and 10.3 rebounds per game last season to earn Class C-2 All-State honors. He will provide depth at the backup center position for the Wildcats this season.

Wayne State faces another rigorous schedule in the 2008-09 season, playing non-conference games against Nebraska-Kearney, NAIA national power Morningside to go with non-league games against St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth, MSU Moorhead and Minnesota, Crookston from the expanded Northern Sun Conference. The Northern Sun Conference schedule will be tougher than ever with the addition of Augustana, Minnesota State, Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State from the former North Central Conference. "With the addition of the four teams joining the conference, it just adds more to the talent pool of this league," stated Burkett. "The Northern Sun Conference will be one of the premier conferences in NCAA Division II men's basketball. Minnesota State, Winona State (the defending NSIC and NCAA national champion) and Northern State will again be the teams to beat as all three teams bring back a significant core of veteran players. Southwest Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and Augustana all return a solid group that could surprise."

The Wildcats open the 2008-09 season at the St. Cloud State Hoopster Classic on November 15 and 16, playing NSIC schools Minnesota, Crookston and St. Cloud State in a pair of non-league contests. The Wildcats play their first home game on Wednesday, November 19th against NAIA power Morningside followed by a Monday, November 24th home encounter against in-state rival Nebraska-Kearney. WSC opens Northern Sun Conference play on Friday, December 5th at Northern State.

# THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992 the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota. In the 2008-09 academic year, the NSIC expanded to a 14-team league with the addition of Augustana College, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, Mankato and St. Cloud State University.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for the 76 years of its existence. Minnesota State University, Mankato and St. Cloud State were also charter members, but left the league in 1981 (MSU left the league in 1969 and returned in 1977). The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed the league in 2005-06 through 2007-08 seasons, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, Concordia University, St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston in 1999, the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006 and Augustana College in 2008. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks in 2003. Michigan Tech was part of the NIC from 1969 to 1977 as well.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

The NSIC has gained national recognition in recent years as three teams have won National Championships. Winona State men's basketball made three straight trips to the NCAA Division II National Championship game, winning the 2006 and 2008 games and losing the 2007 game on a last second shot. During that period, the Warriors won an NCAA record 57 consecutive games. Concordia University, St. Paul garnered the first women's title in 2007 as its volleyball team won the National Championship.

Following the 2004-05 season, Winona State became the first team other than Minnesota Duluth to capture the NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Warriors have taken home the trophy now the last two seasons. Winona State put the NSIC on the national map in 2006 as they hosted and won the NCAA North Central Regional Tournament and went on to capture the Division II National Championship.

Since 2000, the NSIC has participated in one of two officially-sanctioned NCAA Division II football bowl games in the country. Dating back to 1948, the Mineral Water Bowl is hosted by the Quarterback Club of Excelsior Springs, Missouri. The game matches the highest-finishing team from the NSIC not selected for the NCAA Division II playoffs against the highest-finishing team from the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) not participating in the NCAA Division II playoffs. The first NSIC/MIAA meeting in 2000 marked the Mineral Water Bowl's inaugural year of the Division II era. Wayne State represented the NSIC in the 2007 Mineral Water Bowl game and dropped a hard-fought 20-13 contest to Missouri Western.

Over the years the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."

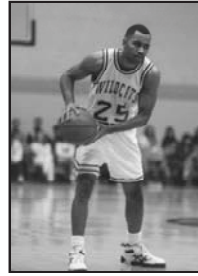

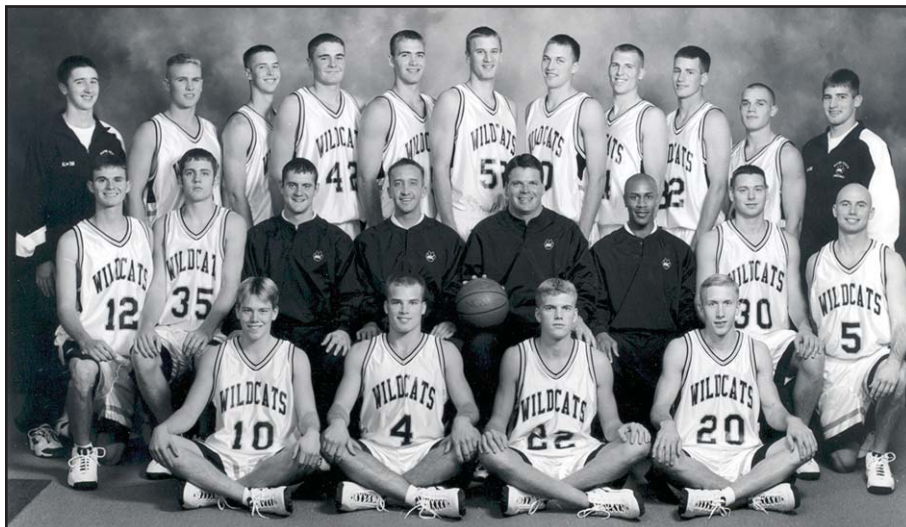
