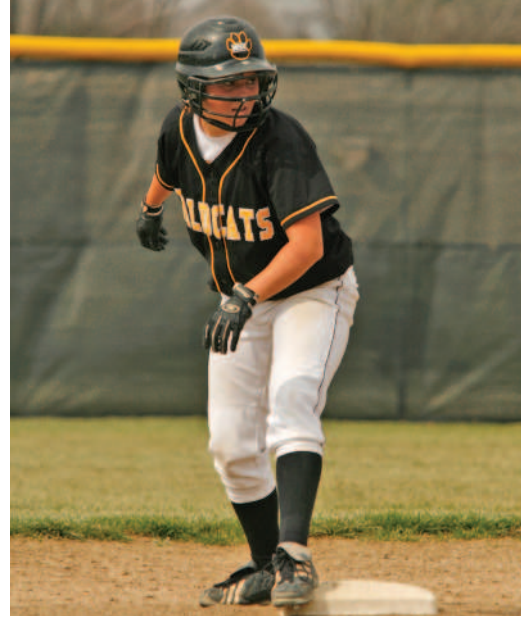

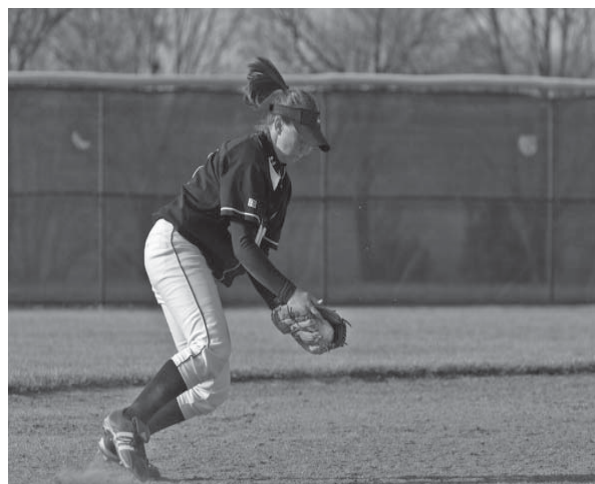

Founded in 1891 as Nebraska Normal College, Wayne State College, in Wayne, Neb. earned a distinguished reputation as a teachers' college from its early days. We're still a great teachers' college—but so much more!

## Innovative Programs

Wayne State's four academic schools—Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Counseling, and Natural and Social Sciences—offer a comprehensive selection of courses. You'll find over 150 majors and minors ranging from pre-professional studies to criminal justice to a nationally accredited undergraduate sports management program, and many others in 14 academic departments across campus.

The Rural Health Opportunities Program (RHOP) at Wayne State College provides pre-professional training in medicine, pharmacy and dentistry in cooperation with the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Students who successfully complete the program at WSC are automatically accepted into medical, pharmacy, or dental school at UNMC.

Upper-level education majors at Wayne State have the opportunity to participate in the Northeast Nebraska Teacher Academy (NENTA), the first of its kind in the nation, where WSC students receive classroom experience with participating K-12 schools in the region.

Through WSC WebCat On-line, students can register for class, check on grades and student accounts, from the convenience of their home or residence hall room.

## Excellent Career Preparation

Whether students plan to be accountants or wildlife biologists, they receive the preparation they need at Wayne State College. In addition to classes taught by experts in their fields, Wayne State College provides internship and cooperative programs for students in a number of majors. Many regional businesses actively recruit Wayne State students for internships, with many of these internships resulting in full-time employment after graduation.

The WSC Career Services office assists students with career exploration, job preparation skills, interviews, as well as arranging internships and cooperative experiences.



## Personal Attention

Students at Wayne State College don't get lost in the crowd. With an average class size of 21 and a student/faculty ratio of 19:1, WSC students get to know their professors and classmates. Eighty percent of Wayne State professors have the highest degree in their field—and most teach first-year as well as upper-level classes. You will find dedicated professors and instructors at Wayne State College where teaching is their life's work and their enthusiasm is contagious.

Wayne State College offers a variety of support services and programs to students. The heart of the WSC campus is the Student Center, where academic and personal support services are located. The Learning Center and Peer Tutoring Program are designed to help all students achieve the highest possible level of success in their studies.

## Active Campus Life

With more than 90 clubs and organizations on campus, Wayne State College students have many opportunities to be involved in campus and community life.

Wayne State College has an active Greek life, with Greek Olympics being held at Homecoming each fall, as well as other social and service activities. The Student Activities Board (SAB) plans a variety of special programs each year, bringing musical groups such as Three Doors Down, Terri Clark, Vertical Horizon, Five for Fighting, Goo Goo Dolls, Sawyer Brown, Blackhawk, Firehouse, and others to campus. Comedian Adam Sandler and other national performers have performed on campus.

The Multicultural Center, one of the newest campus programs, provides outreach and support to Wayne State College students and the region through special events during the year.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II, and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball and track, cross country, men's baseball, women's softball, men's and women's golf, and women's soccer.

## Scenic Surroundings

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Student Center, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall. Ramsey Theatre was recently renovated, with the completion in 2004. A new state-of-the-art indoor track was completed in the summer of 2001 in the WSC Recreation Center.

Wayne State College's seven residence halls provide students with a comfortable, affordable and convenient place to live with easy access to the entire campus community. Each hall has lounges and recreation areas, laundry facilities, mail service, academic tutors and study areas. Six of the seven halls are wired for access to the campus computer network from your personal computer. Smoke-free residence halls are also an option.





# WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION

## **Dr. Richard Collings**

*President*



Dr. Richard Collings is in his fourth year as the 11th president of Wayne State College. Prior to assuming the presidency of Wayne State, Collings was vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of political science and public affairs at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, North Carolina, a position he held from 1996-2004. At Western Carolina, he led many academic and administration initiatives, including creating a residential honors college, developing technology partnerships with other institutions throughout the nation

and implementing a strategic planning process.

From 1991-96, Collings was provost and vice president for academic affairs at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, where he had served as dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences from 1989-91. Previously, he was assistant provost and chairperson of the department of political science at Southeast Missouri State in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

A native of Louisville, Ky., Collings earned a Ph.D. in political science in 1977 and a master's degree in Latin American studies in 1972, both from Tulane University. He received a bachelor's degree in international studies from the University of Louisville in 1968.

President Collings and his wife, Marilyn, have three grown children: Michael, Kristen and Kelly. They also have two grandchildren, Ethan and Kai.

## **Eric Schoh**

*Director of Athletics*



Entering his fourth year as athletic director, Eric Schoh has injected enthusiasm and success into the Wildcat athletic department.

Wayne State College placed third in the 2006-07 Northern Sun Conference All-Sports Standings by winning four conference championships (women's cross country, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field). Two teams (volleyball and baseball) also qualified for NCAA post-season competition.

"Everyone associated with Wildcat athletics should be proud of our accomplishments this past year," said Schoh. "The student-athletes, coaches, campus community and people of Wayne all had a hand in our success. It is a credit to the quality student-athletes we have at Wayne State when you are able to combine academic accomplishments with athletic success."

Prior to coming to Wayne State, Schoh was the associate athletic director for development at California State University in Bakersfield, Calif. from 2002-2004. From 1998-2002, Schoh was associate director of athletics at the University of South Dakota. He was the regional director of D.D. Marketing Inc. in Pueblo, Colorado from 1997-98 and was the assistant director of athletics at Montana State University in Billings, Montana from 1995-97.

Schoh earned his master's degree in education from Iowa State University. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications from Iowa State University as well.

Schoh is a native of LaCrescent, Minnesota. He and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Paige, Eric and Tyler.

## **Mike Barry**

*Associate Director of Athletics/  
Facilities Director*



Mike Barry is in his ninth season as associate director of athletics and in his 10th year as the director of sports and recreational facilities. His duties include scheduling athletic contests and practices, home game management and serving as the athletic and recreational facilities' coordinator.

Barry was the Wayne State women's basketball head coach for seven seasons. He compiled a 97-92 record, which is third all-time on the school's career victory list. His best team was the 1993-94 squad which

posted a 22-5 record.

Barry came to Wayne State following two years as an assistant women's basketball coach at Pratt Community College in Kansas. He also coached at Chadron State, Eastern New Mexico University, and Fullerton and Stuart high schools in Nebraska.

Barry, a native of Grant, Neb., was a four-sport athlete at Chadron State. He was a three-time NAIA national qualifier in the triple jump, and also lettered in basketball, football, and cross country.

Barry earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Chadron State in 1983 and earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education in 1988. He and his wife, Jeannette, have two sons, Jordan, 15, and Jalen, 12. Barry also has a son Rick, who lives in Crawford, Nebraska.

## **Dr. Shawn Percy**

*Faculty Athletic Representative*



Dr. Shawn Percy is in his fourth year as Faculty Athletic Representative at Wayne State College. Percy, an associate professor in the Life Sciences Department, is in his 10th year teaching at the school.

An Indiana native, he attended Purdue University and Indiana University, earning his bachelors degree from Indiana University in 1989. While an undergraduate, he participated in crew, ultimate and lacrosse.

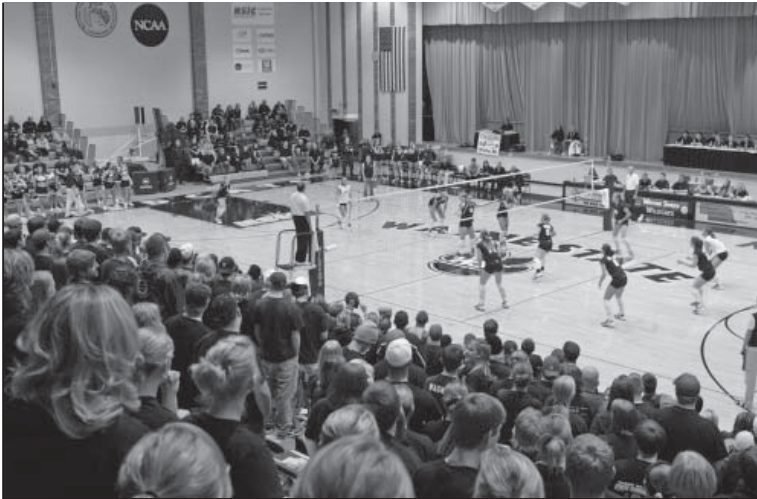
Percy attended graduate school at Washington State University completing his doctorate in Zoophysiology in 1996. He enjoys teaching general biology, human physiology and vertebrae embryology at WSC. Percy is also a nationally-certified EMT and firefighter and serves on the Wayne Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department.

# WAYNE STATE FACILITIES

## Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home for the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include: new balcony seats and a new stage curtain (summer 2007); a new playing surface in 2004; new scoreboards on the north and south walls (summer of 1998); new bleachers in the lower level and a coat of paint (summer of 1996); and a new sound system (spring of 1995). Its facilities include refurbished locker rooms, classrooms, a training room, and a state-of-the-art training facility.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships.



## Strength Training Complex

The Strength Training Complex at Wayne State is one of the finest equipped facilities in the Nebraska State College system.

The 2,400-square foot facility is equipped with a variety of both free weight and variable resistance apparatus. Six Olympic benches, six incline benches, eight squat racks, three hip sleds, two hi-low lateral pull machines and a Pec Dec, along with a complete assortment of dumbbells help facilitate as many as 70 athletes without delay. An extensive remodeling project was responsible for improved lighting, a sound system, and flooring in the strength room. Recently, more renovations were made, including painting the walls, additional mirrors and raising the ceiling in one area for overhead lifting.



## Pete Chapman Baseball & Softball Complex

The Pete Chapman baseball and softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. Located north of Memorial Stadium, the complex provides a picturesque setting for baseball and softball games. The softball field is currently under construction with a new locker room and press box being built above the first base dugout. Players will be able to dress in a heated locker room and store their equipment next to the field instead of having to carry it from the parking lot in previous years. The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest

rooms, a concession stand and a press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season.

## Soccer Field

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the baseball field, the WSC soccer field made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. In 2001, a new scoreboard was put in place along with more grandstands to accommodate the growing population of soccer fans attending games.



# ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES

**TJ Horton**  
*Head Athletic Trainer*



TJ Horton is in his second year at Wayne State College and first as head athletic trainer after serving in an assistant athletic trainer role in 2006-07. He will oversee athletic training responsibilities for 15 varsity sports at Wayne State College.

Before coming to Wayne State, the Deerfield, Kansas native worked at Carson-Newman College in Tennessee, a small Division II school. His responsibilities included working with men's and women's soccer and baseball along with teaching introduction to athletic training. Horton also served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at Creighton University in Omaha while working on his masters degree at UNO. At Creighton, Horton worked with women's soccer, softball and men's and women's tennis.

At the University of Tulsa, Horton was with men's soccer, football, softball, men's tennis and basketball while serving as an athletic training student.

**Dr. Steven Stokesbary**  
*Team Orthopedist*



Dr. Steven Stokesbary enters his sixth season as Wayne State's team orthopedist.

Dr. Stokesbary is a partner in The Center for Neurosciences, Orthopaedics, and Spine Sports Medicine, P.C. (CNOS) in Dakota Dunes, South Dakota. He graduated from the University of Iowa and earned his medical degree also from the University of Iowa College of Medicine, after which he completed his residency at the

University of Missouri Health Services.

Dr. Stokesbary has been practicing for CNOS Sports Medicine for over eight years, which provides athletic training services for over 40 area high schools, colleges and professional organizations.

## **Athletic Training Room**

The Athletic Training Room is the site of taping, treatment and injury evaluations. It has a variety of up to date, quality equipment. A partial inventory of modalities available for athletes include: three whirlpools, RichMar Theratouch 7.7 electrical stimulation machine, RichMar HV-II combination ultrasound/electrical stimulation machine, RichMar portable ultrasound machine, Game-ready intermittent compression machine, Therabath Parafin machine, and Hydrocollator heat pack units. The athletic training room also has three computers.

## **PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center**

The PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center, which opened December 1, 2005, brings a state-of-the-art physical therapy and athletic training facility to its campus. This 4,000-square foot center is located next to the Wayne State College Recreation Center and will serve as the hub of treatment and rehabilitation services.

Dedicated to quality care, the PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center provides the finest in sports rehabilitation, physical therapy and athletic training services to Wayne State student-athletes, campus community and the general public.

In addition to this new facility, the PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center also utilizes the Carlson Natatorium for the aquatic therapy program. The PMC Wildcat Sports Medicine Center represents excellence; a total commitment by Wayne State College to the health of its' students and desire to be an active member of the Wayne community by opening its' doors to the public.



# WILDCAT SOFTBALL COACHING STAFF

## Krista Unger Head Coach



Krista Unger is in her second season as the head softball coach at Wayne State College. Unger directed the Wildcats to a 28-22 record in her first season as head coach, an 18-game improvement from the previous season. It was the first winning season for WSC softball since 2001 and just the second winning record since 1992. The 2007 Wildcats had

a seven-game win streak for the first time since 1992 and were regionally ranked for the first time since joining NCAA Division II. WSC hit a new school record 29 home runs in 2007, more than doubling the previous school mark of 13.

Unger comes to Wayne State after serving two seasons as an assistant coach at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota. She helped SCSU to records of 34-25 in 2005 and 33-24 in 2006 as the Huskies finished second and third respectively in the North Central Conference during Unger's stay.

A native of Missouri Valley, Iowa, Unger was a standout player at the University of Nebraska-Omaha from 1999-2003. She helped the Mavericks to the NCAA Division II national championship in 2001 as a sophomore and finished her career as the all-time winningest pitcher in Maverick softball history with 106 wins and 530 career strikeouts. In the 2001 national championship game, Unger tossed a two-hit shutout with five strikeouts in a 4-0 win over Lewis University. She also ranks second in career shutouts with 43. Unger earned numerous honors as a player at UNO, earning First Team All-NCC honors three times while also collecting three All-NCC Academic Team awards. She was named to the NFCA All-Region First Team in 2002 and was a Second Team All-Region selection in 2001. Unger was also selected the North Central Conference Freshman of the Year in 2000.

Unger also has coaching experience at the high school level, serving as the JV-Varsity pitching coach at Omaha Gross High School in the fall of 2003 and at state-qualifying Omaha Westside High School in 2004.

Unger earned her bachelor's degree of science in physical education K-12 with an endorsement in coaching from the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2004 and received her master's degree in sport management in May, 2006 from St. Cloud State University in Minnesota.

## Stephanie Kuhl Graduate Assistant Coach



Stephanie Kuhl begins her first season as a graduate assistant softball coach for the Wildcats and will serve as the team's hitting coach.

Kuhl just completed a stellar playing career at Division I South Dakota State University, finishing as the school's all-time leader in home runs and runs batted in. She also holds the single season school marks for home runs and RBI's. In high school, Stephanie Kuhl was a three time All-State selection and a four-time All-Conference honoree in softball at Logan-Magnolia in Iowa. She also played five years of club softball for the Omaha Quakes and earned All-Conference recognition in volleyball and basketball and qualified for the Iowa State High School Track and Field Meet in the discuss as a junior.

# 2008 SOFTBALL SEASON PREVIEW

The 2008 Wayne State College softball team looks to build off a strong turnaround season in 2007 and will rely on a youthful squad to move up the Northern Sun Conference ladder.

WSC posted a 28-22 record in 2007 under first-year head coach Krista Unger, an 18-game improvement from the 2006 record of 10-34. It was the Wildcats' first winning season in softball since 2001 and just the second time since 1992 that a WSC softball team posted a winning record. The 2007 team posted a new school record with 29 home runs, more than doubling the previous school mark of 13 set in 1999. This year's team is expected to have even more power than last year so expect to see more new school records from this young bunch of Wildcats in 2008.

Unger has another young squad for the 2008 season with just one senior, three juniors, one sophomore and a talented freshmen class of 10 who will be called on to contribute immediately to the Wildcats' success in 2008.

"Our team is young, but strong willed," commented Coach Unger. "Each day we get mentally and physically stronger offensively and defensively. I have high expectations of this team for the 2008 season."

Because of their continuing hard work on and off the field, I expect to see solid defense and strong hitting during every Wildcat game. Our outfield is faster, the infield more consistent and the pitching will be a significant threat to every team we challenge."

The lone senior on this year's team is Dawn Spale, who will play first base and some outfield along with playing a key role as the team's top pinch-hitter.

Junior outfielder Amy Sandstrom is the team's top returning hitter after batting .315 last season while starting and playing in all 50 games. Sandstrom ranked second on the team last season in hits with 52 and runs scored with 30 while finishing in a tie for the team lead in doubles with 11.

The only experienced pitcher returning is junior Kiley Peterson, who posted a 12-9 record last season with a 2.89 ERA. Peterson finished with seven complete games and had one save in 140.1 innings pitched. Another key returner

is sophomore Valerie Robinson, who hit .301 last season as the Wildcats' shortstop but this season will likely see playing time in the outfield.

A talented group of 10 freshmen will be needed to step in right away and contribute to the team's success in 2008. The group is headlined by pitcher Katie Goetzinger of Harlan, Iowa, who was the honorary captain for the Omaha World Herald's Iowa Class 4A/3A All-State Teams after striking out 463 batters last season. Des Moines (Iowa) East High School sensation Jennifer Radley is the expected starting first baseman for the 'Cats this season. Blaire Kuhl of Logan-Magnolia HS in Iowa is the projected starting second baseman while Millard North standout Alaina Novotny will man the corner at third base for the 'Cats in 2008.

Sergeant Bluff-Luton (Iowa) HS standouts Samantha Earleywine and Amber Baird are expected to play key roles for Wayne State in 2008 with Earleywine projected to start at catcher with Baird playing some outfield along with providing relief on the mound for the Wildcats. Emily Walker of Beatrice was a two sport standout in high school (soccer and softball) and will bring those same talents to Wayne State this season. Sarah Gottschalk of Colon, Nebraska (Wahoo HS) will see playing time at shortstop along with Omaha Skutt graduate Hannah Engelkamp, who will also see time in left field this season for WSC.

The goals for the 2008 season have been set high: a .750 winning percentage, a team batting average of .300 and a .980 fielding percentage. # About the NSIC

Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992 the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Minnesota, Nebraska and South Dakota. In the 1999-00 academic year, the NSIC became an expanded 10-team league from a previous seven-member conference. The league expands back to 10 teams as the University of Mary in Bismarck, N.D., and Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, will start league play in the fall of 2006.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for the 74 years of its existence. The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed following the 2003-04 season, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, while Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston became members in 1999. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks in 2003.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

Following the 2004-05 season, Winona State became the first team other than Minnesota Duluth to capture the NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Warriors have taken home the trophy now the last two seasons. Winona State put the NSIC on the national map in 2006 as they hosted and won the NCAA North Central Regional Tournament and went on to capture the Division II National Championship.

Wayne State College finished a close second to Winona State in the 2005-06 NSIC All-Sports Competition. The Wildcats won five conference championships (men's cross country, women's basketball, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field) and sent three teams to NCAA Regional competition (volleyball, women's basketball and baseball). WSC hosted the NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic, along with the NSIC Baseball and Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

Over the years, the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."

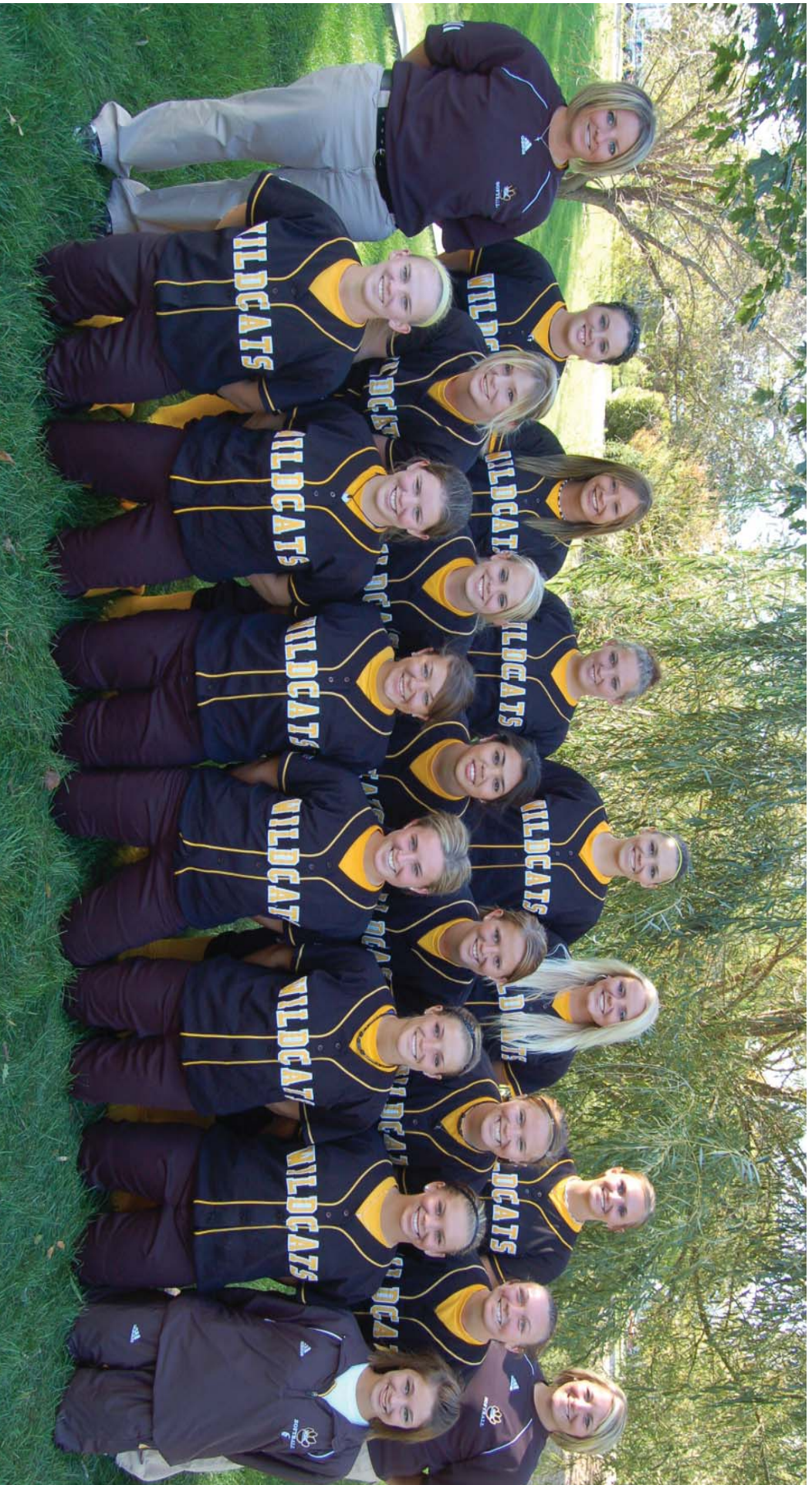
