MEDIA INFORMATION



MEDIA GUIDELINES

CREDENTIALS

Requests for press, radio, photography and television credentials should be made one week prior to the game to insure seating along press row. Requests should be directed to Sports Information Director Mike Grosz. Only members of the working media will be issued credentials.

Credentials may be picked up at the will-call window, located at the west entrance to Rice Auditorium. Credentials must be visible at all times.

RADIO

A visitor's radio table, equipped with a courtesy phone line, is on the stage behind the visiting team's bench. Radio stations should contact the Sports Information Office a week before the game to receive broadcast information.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographers must follow all NCAA and WSC regulations concerning permissible locations to take photos. Photographers are not allowed behind press row and the team benches, but are allowed to take photos from the stage.

PARKING

Limited space is available in a reserved parking lot outside Rice Auditorium. Contact the Sports Information Office for parking availability.

WEEKLY INTERVIEWS

Coach Williams and the WSC players will be available for interviews during the week. Interviews are not allowed during practices and before games. Interview requests should be made through the Sports Information Office.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

After a brief "cooling off" period, Coach Williams and the WSC players will be available for post-game interviews near press row. Interview requests with WSC players will be taken toward the end of the game.

STATISTICS

A complete package of pre-game notes and statistics will be available. Halftime statistics will also be provided.

Final statistics, including a play-by-play, will be distributed to press row approximately 15-20 minutes after the game.

The Sports Information Office will fax results to any desired media outlet. Fax lists should be submitted three days prior to the game.

Founded in 1891 as Nebraska Normal College, Wayne State College, in Wayne, Neb. earned a distinguished reputation as a teachers' college from its early days. We're still a great teachers' college—but so much more!

Innovative Programs

Wayne State's four academic schools—Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Counseling, and Natural and Social Sciences—offer a comprehensive selection of courses. You'll find over 150 majors and minors ranging from pre-professional studies to criminal justice to a nationally accredited undergraduate sports management program, and many others in 14 academic departments across campus.

The Rural Health Opportunities Program (RHOP) at Wayne State College provides pre-professional training in medicine, pharmacy and dentistry in cooperation with the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Students who successfully complete the program at WSC are automatically accepted into medical, pharmacy, or dental school at UNMC.

Upper-level education majors at Wayne State have the opportunity to participate in the Northeast Nebraska Teacher Academy (NENTA), the first of its kind in the nation, where WSC students receive classroom experience with participating K-12 schools in the region.

Through WSC WebCat On-line, students can register for class, check on grades and student accounts, from the convenience of their home or residence hall room.

Excellent Career Preparation

Whether students plan to be accountants or wildlife biologists, they receive the preparation they need at Wayne State College. In addition to classes taught by experts in their fields, Wayne State College provides internship and cooperative programs for students in a number of majors. Many regional businesses actively recruit Wayne State students for internships, with many of these internships resulting in full-time employment after graduation.

The WSC Career Services office assists students with career exploration, job preparation skills, interviews, as well as arranging internships and cooperative experiences.



Personal Attention

Students at Wayne State College don't get lost in the crowd. With an average class size of 21 and a student/faculty ratio of 19:1, WSC students get to know their professors and classmates. Eighty percent of Wayne State professors have the highest degree in their field—and most teach first-year as well as upper-level classes. You will find dedicated professors and instructors at Wayne State College where teaching is their life's work and their enthusiasm is contagious.

Wayne State College offers a variety of support services and programs to students. The heart of the WSC campus is the Student Center, where academic and personal support services are located. The Learning Center and Peer Tutoring Program are designed to help all students achieve the highest possible level of success in their studies.

Active Campus Life

With more than 90 clubs and organizations on campus, Wayne State College students have many opportunities to be involved in campus and community life.

Wayne State College has an active Greek life, with Greek Olympics being held at Homecoming each fall, as well as other social and service activities. The Student Activities Board (SAB) plans a variety of special programs each year, bringing musical groups such as Dierks Bentley, Three Doors Down, Terri Clark, Vertical Horizon, Five for Fighting, Goo Goo Dolls, Sawyer Brown, Blackhawk, Firehouse, and others to campus. Comedian Adam Sandler and other national performers have performed on campus.

The Multicultural Center, one of the newest campus programs, provides outreach and support to Wayne State College students and the region through special events during the year.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II, and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball and track, cross country, men's baseball, women's softball, men's and women's golf, and women's soccer.

Scenic Surroundings

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Student Center, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall. Ramsey Theatre was recently renovated, with the completion in 2004. A new state-of-the-art indoor track was completed in the summer of 2001 in the WSC Recreation Center.

Wayne State College's seven residence halls provide students with a comfortable, affordable and convenient place to live with easy access to the entire campus community. WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Richard Collings
President

Dr. Richard Collings is in his fourth year as the 11th president of Wayne State College. Prior to assuming the presidency of Wayne State, Collings was vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of political science and public affairs at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, North Carolina, a position he held from 1996-2004. At Western Carolina, he led many academic and administration initiatives, including creating a residential honors college, developing technology partnerships with other institutions throughout the nation and implementing a strategic planning process.

From 1991-96, Collings was provost and vice president for academic affairs at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, where he had served as dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences from 1989-91. Previously, he was assistant provost and chairperson of the department of political science at Southeast Missouri State in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

A native of Louisville, Ky., Collings earned a Ph.D. in political science in 1977 and a master's degree in Latin American studies in 1972, both from Tulane University. He received a bachelor's degree in international studies from the University of Louisville in 1968.

President Collings and his wife, Marilyn, have three grown children: Michael, Kristen and Kelly. They also have two grandchildren, Ethan and Kai.



Eric Schoh
Director of Athletics

Entering his fourth year as athletic director, Eric Schoh has injected enthusiasm and success into the Wildcat athletic department.

Wayne State placed third in the 2006-2007 Northern Sun Conference All-Sports Standings by winning four conference championships (women's cross country, men's indoor track and field, baseball and men's outdoor track and field). Two teams (volleyball and baseball) also qualified for NCAA post-season competition.

"Everyone associated with Wildcat athletics should be proud of our accomplishments this past year," said Schoh. "The student-athletes, coaches, campus community and people of Wayne all had a hand in our success. It is a credit to the quality student-athletes we have at Wayne State when you are able to combine academic accomplishments with athletic success."

Prior to coming to Wayne State, Schoh was the associate athletic director for development at California State University in Bakersfield, Calif. from 2002-2004. From 1998-2002, Schoh was associate director of athletics at the University of South Dakota.

He was the regional director of D.D. Marketing Inc. in Pueblo, Colorado from 1997-98 and was the assistant director of athletics at Montana State University in Billings, Montana from 1995-97.

Schoh earned his master's degree in education from Iowa State University. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications from Iowa State University as well.

Schoh is a native of LaCrescent, Minnesota. He and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Paige, Eric and Tyler.



Mike Barry
*Associate Director of Athletics/
Facilities Director*

Mike Barry is in his ninth season as associate director of athletics and in his 10th year as the director of sports and recreational facilities. His duties include scheduling athletic contests and practices, home game management and serving as the athletic and recreational facilities' coordinator.

Barry was the Wayne State women's basketball head coach for seven seasons. He compiled a 97-92 record, which is third all-time on the school's career victory list. His best team was the 1993-94 squad which posted a 22-5 record.

Barry came to Wayne State following two years as an assistant women's basketball coach at Pratt Community College in Kansas. He also coached at Chadron State, Eastern New Mexico University, and Fullerton and Stuart high schools in Nebraska.

Barry, a native of Grant, Neb., was a four-sport athlete at Chadron State. He was a three-time NAIA national qualifier in the triple jump, and also lettered in basketball, football, and cross country.

Barry earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Chadron State in 1983 and earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education in 1988. He and his wife, Jeannette, have two sons, Jordan, 15, and Jalen, 12. Barry also has a son Rick, who lives in Crawford, Neb.



Dr. Shawn Percy
Faculty Athletic Representative

Dr. Shawn Percy is in his fourth year as Faculty Athletic Representative at Wayne State College. Percy, an associate professor in the Life Sciences Department, is in his 10th year teaching at the school. An Indiana native, he attended Purdue University and Indiana University, earning his bachelors degree from Indiana University in 1989. While an undergraduate, he participated in crew, ultimate and lacrosse.

Percy attended graduate school at Washington State University completing his doctorate in Zoophysiology in 1996. He enjoys teaching general biology, human physiology and vertebrae embryology at WSC. Percy is also a nationally-certified EMT and firefighter and serves on the Wayne Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department.



STUDENT-ATHLETE SERVICES



Wayne State College offers numerous academic support services designed to help students succeed in the classroom. The WSC Athletic Department utilizes many of these services to assist its student-athletes in their pursuit of a four-year degree.

"We have a very strong supporting cast here at Wayne State College," says Compliance Coordinator Marilyn Yates, noting the Athletic Department administration, the coaches, and the staffs from the Learning Center, STRIDE office and the registrar's office. "They are the reason for our academic success."

Some of the services utilized by the Athletic Department are study tables, the Peer Tutor Program, the Writing Help Desk, the STRIDE Program, and the Athletic Academic Program.

Study Tables

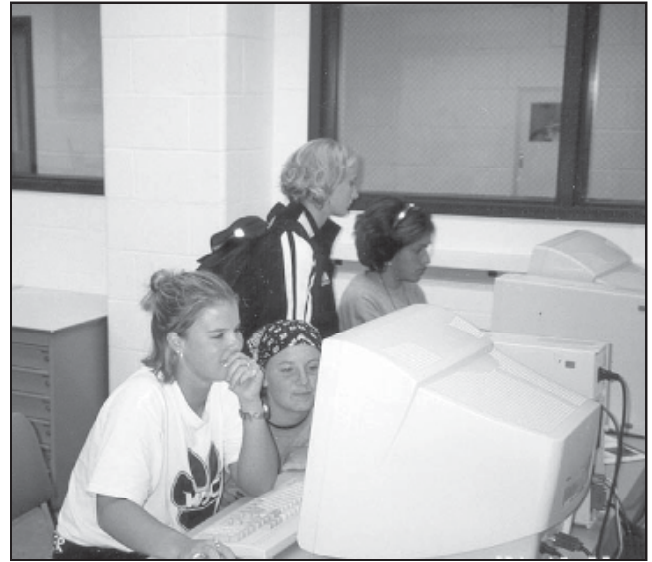
Each head coach has the option of conducting and monitoring a study table for his or her players.

Writing Help Desk

The Writing Help Desk, coordinated by the Student Learning Center, is designed to help students' written communication and academic writing skills. The Help Desk will help students clarify concepts, improve critical thinking, work on organization, increase vocabulary, and write logical, grammatically correct sentences.

Peer Tutor Program

WSC's nationally certified Peer Tutor Program consists of upper level students who are highly recommended by their academic divisions and meet stringent qualifications. The program, coordinated by the Learning Center, provides peer tutoring for all four academic schools. Tutors work with the faculty and in turn academically assist students.



STRIDE Program

A federally-funded program, STRIDE (Students Taking Responsibility in Development and Education) is a program for students who meet one of the following criteria: 1. a first generation college student; 2. has some type of a learning disability; 3. meets federal low income guidelines. STRIDE offers peer tutoring in all required general education courses and many upper level courses. A mentor program is offered to first-year students to assist with the transition to college life. Students with a learning disability are provided with an individualized, cooperatively planned program of services and accommodations. These may include taped textbooks, alternative exam arrangements, note taking assistance, adaptive computer equipment and course modifications.

At the midpoint of each semester, STRIDE sends out progress reports, charting the student's attendance, performance on daily assignments, projects and exams, and class participation.

Athletic Academic Program

Co-sponsored by the Student Learning Center and the Athletic Department, the AAP is designed to help the at-risk student-athlete. All transfer students, partial qualifiers and student-athletes with a cumulative GPA of 2.20 or below are placed in the program. Graduate students work as mentors with the athletes five hours per week with the following purposes: 1. increase the probability of a student's success in passing academic subject; 2. increase the student's self-confidence and motivation; 3. develop study skills; 4. individualize the learning-teaching process for the student; 5. supplement instructional resources.



WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field

Memorial Stadium has been "Home of the Wildcats" since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium following World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box was built at the time of the grandstand construction, with a second level being added in 1969. Bob Cunningham Field has seating for 2,500 fans and has a natural grass surface.



Recreation Center

The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987 and is the college's main facility for student recreation and selected athletic activities.

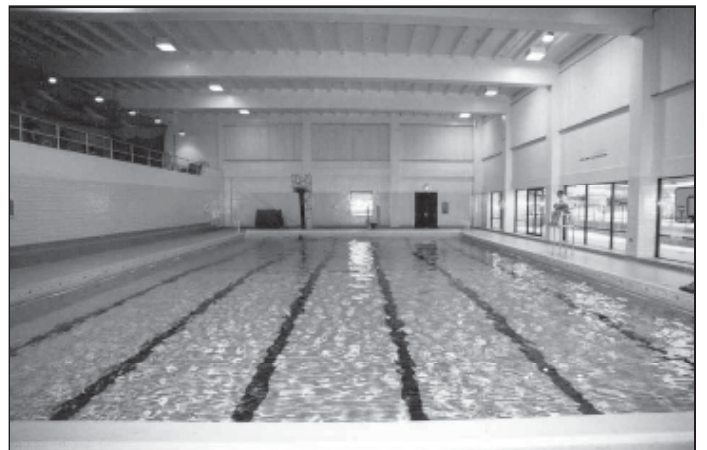
The main area in the Recreation Center provides a state-of-the-art six-lane running track that was resurfaced in 2001 and three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis, and badminton. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff as well as residents of the Wayne community.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams, and offices for the WSC athletic department.



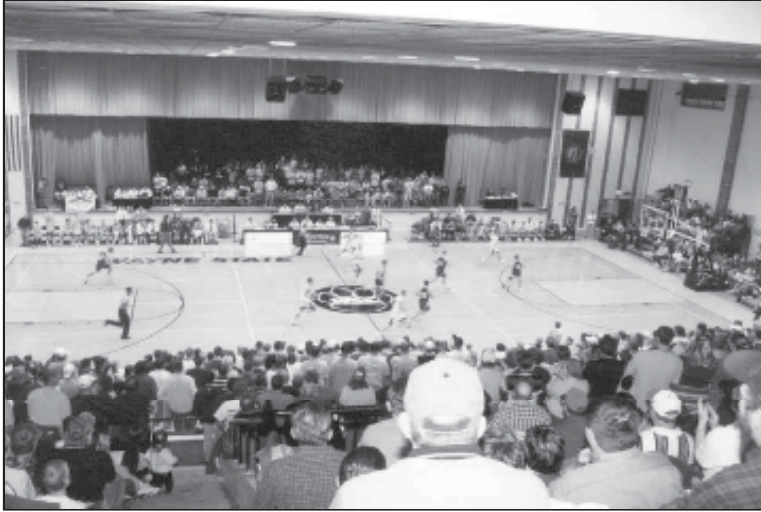
Carlson Natatorium

Carlson Natatorium adjoins the Recreation Center and Rice Auditorium. The 25-yard long pool is used for a variety of functions, including lap swimming, aquasize classes, senior wellness aquasize classes, HHPS classes, intramural activities and athletic training rehabilitation exercises. The natatorium is open in the summer for use by the athletic camps and Rec Center members.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home for the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include: new balcony seats and a new stage curtain (summer 2007); new playing surface in 2004; new scoreboards on the north and south walls (summer of 1998); new bleachers in the lower level (summer of 1996); and a new sound system (spring of 1995). Its facilities include refurbished locker rooms, classrooms, a training room, and a state-of-the-art training facility.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships and the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Championships.

Strength Training Complex

The Strength Training Complex at Wayne State is one of the finest equipped facilities in the Nebraska State College system.

The 2,400-square foot facility is equipped with a variety of both free weight and variable resistance apparatus. Six Olympic benches, six incline benches, eight squat racks, three hip sleds, two hi-low lateral pull machines and a Pec Dec, along with a complete assortment of dumbbells help facilitate as many as 70 athletes without delay. An extensive remodeling project was responsible for improved lighting, a sound system, and flooring in the strength room. Recently, more renovations were made, including painting the walls, additional mirrors and raising the ceiling in one area for overhead lifting.



Pete Chapman Baseball & Softball Complex

The baseball and softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. Located north of Memorial Stadium, the complex provides a picturesque setting for baseball and softball games. The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and a press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season. In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor

of the late athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, construction began on a locker room/press box on the softball field.

Soccer Field

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the baseball field, the WSC soccer field made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. In 2001, a new scoreboard was put in place along with more grandstands to accommodate the growing population of soccer fans attending games.

HEAD COACH RYUN WILLIAMS



Ryun Williams is in his 10th season as the head women's basketball coach at Wayne State College. He is the school's all-time winningest coach with a mark of 160-96, including 83-51 in Northern Sun Conference play, entering the 2007-08 season. His winning percentage of .625 ranks 42nd among current NCAA Division II head coaches.

Williams guided the Wildcats to a 19-10 record in the 2006-07 season and an 11-7 mark in the NSIC, good for a fourth place finish. WSC advanced to the NSIC Red Baron

Women's Basketball Classic semi-finals before falling to eventual champion Concordia-St. Paul 83-74.

It was a season to remember for the Wildcats in 2005-06 under Williams as WSC notched a 27-4 mark, the best season in school history. Wayne State won its first-ever Northern Sun Conference regular season championship with a 13-1 league mark, earning the right to host the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic. The Wildcats scored an exciting 59-54 win over Northern State in the championship game and was awarded an automatic berth to the NCAA Division II National Tournament for the first time in school history. Williams received the Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year Award for leading the Wildcats to their first-ever NSIC regular season title.

With the success in 2005-06, WSC women's basketball achieved several new accomplishments, including the school's first-ever Top 25 national ranking. The Wildcats were ranked as high as 19th in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25 Coaches Poll before finishing the season ranked 25th, the first time that WSC ended the season ranked in the national poll. For just the second time in school history, WSC notched back-to-back 20 win seasons in women's basketball. The Wildcats were 27-4 in 2005-06 and 20-11 in 2004-05 under Williams. The only other time WSC posted back-to-back 20 win seasons was in 1976-77 (25-7) and 1977-78 (20-11). The 2005-06 team also set a new school record for consecutive wins as the Wildcats won 17 straight games, passing the old school mark of 13 consecutive wins during the 1976-77 season.

Williams became the all-time winningest coach in WSC women's basketball history during the 2005-06 season, passing G.I. Willoughby on December 1, 2005 when the Wildcats topped Augustana College 54-48.

Coach Williams was named the ninth head women's basketball coach at Wayne State College on April 21, 1998. In his first year with the Wildcats, Williams compiled a 15-12 record, which was the program's first winning campaign in four years. Williams' squad was also honored on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) 1999 Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll. The Wildcats ranked fourth on the honor roll, compiling a 3.576 team grade point average during the 1998-99 season. Williams guided the Wildcats to a 20-11 overall record in 2004-05, including a 7-7 mark in the Northern Sun Conference. It was the first 20-win season for the Wildcats under Williams.

"We want a successful program," Williams said. "We want a program where we are winning on the court, in the classroom and in the community. Our job isn't to create great basketball players. Our job is to create great individuals who will be successful in life."

Williams came to Wayne State after serving three years as the head women's basketball coach at Sheridan College, a junior college in Sheridan, Wyo. During that time, Williams

turned Sheridan into one of the top programs in the region. In three seasons as a head coach, he posted a 54-38 record. After a 7-21 record during his first season in 1995-96, Williams guided the Lady Generals to a 19-12 mark in 1996-97 and a 28-5 record in 1997-98. The 1997-98 Wyoming Conference and Region IX Coach of the Year, Williams led Sheridan to the Wyoming Conference title and a runner-up finish at the Region IX Tournament. The Lady Generals were ranked 14th in the final junior college national rankings.

Williams began his coaching career at Sheridan College in 1993. Prior to becoming the head women's basketball coach, he served as an assistant men's basketball coach, and was the head women's volleyball coach for four years, compiling a 117-66 record. Williams guided the Lady Generals to a 33-14 record and a No. 14 national ranking in 1994. In 1995, Sheridan went 42-8 and finished fifth at the junior college national tournament. In both years, Williams garnered Wyoming Conference and Region IX Coach of the Year honors.

Williams played two seasons at Sheridan College, where he was an All-Region IX player as a sophomore. He then transferred to the University of South Dakota, where he earned All-NCC honors after leading the nation in free throw percentage at 91.2 percent. He also was named academic all-conference as a junior and senior. As a high school senior at Campbell County High School, Williams was named the first-ever Mr. Basketball for the state of Wyoming in 1988.

Williams earned his associates degree from Sheridan College in 1990, his bachelors degree from the University of South Dakota in 1992 and his masters degree from the University of South Dakota in 1997.

Williams and his wife Lyndy have two daughters, Natalie, age 10, and Emily, age 7, and they reside in Wayne.

Allison Kruger Assistant Coach



Allison Kruger is in her fourth year as an assistant coach at Wayne State College. Her main duties at Wayne State include working with the post players, coordinating strength and conditioning programs, practice preparation and recruiting.

Kruger comes to WSC after a stellar career at Nebraska-Kearney, where she was selected Second Team All-American as a senior in 2003-04. While at UNK, Kruger was selected the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Player of the Year twice (2002 and 2003) and was named First Team All-RMAC as a junior and senior. Kruger was also tabbed Second Team All-Region twice and was an honorable mention All-American as a junior. As a junior and senior, Kruger was also selected Third Team Academic All-District.

Kruger ranks second all-time in points at UNK (1,682), fourth in rebounds (788), fourth in blocks (91), second in free throws made (426) and second in free throws attempted (585). She helped lead UNK to four NCAA Tournament appearances and four RMAC titles.

Kruger earned her masters degree in sport management at Wayne State College in May, 2006 and resides in Wayne.



Lindsay Erwin Graduate Assistant Coach



Lindsay Erwin begins her second season as a graduate assistant coach for the WSC women's basketball program. She comes to Wayne State after serving as head boys basketball coach at Parkview Christian High School in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Erwin was a standout player at Chadron State College where she was a four-year starter for the Eagles.

She finished her career 10th on the all-time rebounding charts and 17th in career scoring. While at Chadron State, Lindsay was awarded the "Clyde Bond Memorial Award", given to an athlete that demonstrates good sportsmanship, work ethic and attitude. She graduated from Chadron State in May, 2005 with a bachelors degree in sports leadership with a minor in business management.

Erwin, a graduate of Lincoln East High School (2001), is pursuing a masters degree at Wayne State College in sport management.

2007-2008 WILDCAT OUTLOOK



Ryun Williams begins his 10th season as women's basketball coach at Wayne State College. He will rely on three returning starters and a talented group of five incoming freshmen to match last season's 19-10 mark.

"We have many new faces in a Wildcat uniform this year," remarked Williams, who is the all-time winningest coach in Wildcat women's basketball history with a 160-96 career mark, including 83-51 in Northern Sun Conference games. "The success of this group will be determined in how quickly our freshmen can adopt to the collegiate game and the production of our returners. A lot will be expected of our returners both on the floor in their production but off the floor as well in leading the youth of this team."

The three returning starters are senior guard Andrea Schoepf, junior forward Kylee McGill and sophomore guard Teresa Case. Schoepf, a graduate of South Sioux City HS, is the 'Cats top returning scorer at 11.8 points per game last season and hit a team-high 48 three pointers. "Andrea will need to be the perimeter threat for us," said Williams. "She can really shoot it, but the improvement of her penetration game will increase her ability to score more for us this year as well."

McGill, a 6-1 junior from Little River, Kansas, averaged 10.2 points and 7.7 rebounds per game last season to earn NSIC All-Conference honorable mention honors. She ranked fourth in the Northern Sun Conference in rebounding while shooting 52.9 percent from the field, which was third-best in the NSIC. "Kylee is ready to have a great year," stated Williams. "She has very good perimeter skills and the ability to shoot the three. Kylee will be expected to score more than she has in the past as well as lead our team defensively."

The third returning starter is 5-6 sophomore Teresa Case, a graduate of Sioux Falls (SD) Roosevelt High School. Last season, she averaged 6.6 points and 2.8 rebounds per game while ranking 11th in the NSIC in steals per game at 1.25 and will replace two-year starter Lauren Gustafson at the point guard position. "Teresa will be our quarterback this year and will be called upon to run the show," Williams remarked. "She is our best player at attacking the basket and can really shoot it as well."

Senior Amanda Covington, a 6-2 backup center, averaged 7.6 points and 3.3 rebounds per game off the bench last season while blocking a team-high 27 shots and will be a proven leader coming off the bench this season. "Amanda has added more versatility and variety to her game which should make her tougher to guard," said Williams.

Sophomores Kati Jo Christensen and Jennifer Yee gained valuable experience at the guard position last season and will be looked at for scoring punch off the bench this season. Yee averaged 3.9 points per game while shooting 42 percent (31 of 73) from the three point line last season while Christensen

played in all 29 games last season averaging 2.9 points a game.

Five freshmen and one junior college transfer will make the Wildcats a deeper squad this season while also contending for considerable playing time. "We are very excited about the newcomers to this team," added Williams. "Valuable minutes will be called on for Mara Hjelle, JulieAnn Wagner, Laquisha Cook as well as Jodie Boss and Alyssa Fischbach.

Hjelle is a 6-2 freshman center from White Bear Lake, Minnesota who averaged 11.9 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. Wagner is a 5-11 forward from Sioux Falls (SD) Roosevelt High School and earned First Team Class AA All-State honors averaging 14 points a contest as a senior. Fischbach, a 5-11 guard from Northwestern High School in South Dakota, averaged 20.2 points and 8.6 rebounds per game last season. Boss, a 6-4 center from Columbus, was named Second Team Class A All-State last season while averaging 12.9 points and 9.4 rebounds per game and Laquisha Cook, a 5-9 guard, transferred to Wayne State from Tyler Junior College in Texas after averaging 11 points and 3.7 rebounds per game last season. Another freshman, Paige Pollard from Newcastle, will battle for playing time after earning Class D-2 All-State honors last season averaging 16 points and 9.4 rebounds a game for the Red Raiders.

"Mara and Laquisha are potential newcomers who could break into the starting lineup," boasted Williams. "Mara competes and posts up harder than any freshman we have ever recruited while Laquisha is very athletic and will be called upon to be our defensive stopper and a penetrator on offense."

Despite going 11-7 last season in the NSIC and finishing in fourth place, the Wildcats are picked to finish sixth this season according to the NSIC preseason coaches poll. "The Northern Sun Conference is a great league with a lot of parity," said Williams, who picked preseason favorite Concordia-St. Paul and second place MSU Moorhead as the teams to beat in the league this season.

The Wildcats also face a rigorous non-conference schedule with games against the likes of South Dakota, Nebraska-Kearney and Augustana. UNK and Augustana were North Central Regional qualifiers last season. "Once again the schedule provides up with many great challenges and opportunities," commented Williams. "With all of this youth, I know we will go through some growing pains but when the talent and chemistry is developed this team has a chance to be a good one."

Wayne State will open the season at home on Friday and Saturday, November 16 and 17 hosting the Wildcat Classic, entertaining Colorado Christian and Colorado Mines. The Wildcats have a total of 14 home games this season at Rice Auditorium.

THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992 the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North and South Dakota. In the 1999-00 academic year, the NSIC became an expanded 10-team league from a previous seven-member conference. The conference featured eight members from 2004-05 until 2005-06 but the league expanded back to 10 teams in 2006-07 as the University of Mary in Bismarck, N.D., and Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, joined the league.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for the 73 years of its existence. The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed following the 2003-04 season, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston in 1999 and the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks in 2003.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

Following the 2004-05 season, Winona State became the first team other than Minnesota Duluth to capture the NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Warriors have taken home the trophy now the last two seasons. The Warriors put the NSIC on the map in 2006 as they hosted and won the NCAA North Central Regional Tournament and advanced to the Elite Eight. Although Winona State wasn't the first men's basketball team to compete in the Elite Eight (SW Minnesota State in 2001 & Northern State in 1998) but they were the first to win it. The National Championship for Winona State marked the first NCAA Title for any NSIC institution.

Since 2000, the NSIC has participated in the only officially-sanctioned NCAA Division II football bowl game in the country. With a rich history dating back to 1948, the Mineral Water Bowl is hosted by the Quarterback Club of Excelsior Springs., Mo. The game matches the highest-finishing team from the NSIC not selected for the NCAA Division II playoffs against the highest-finishing team from the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) not participating in the NCAA Division II playoffs. Now in its 41st year, the first game was played on Thanksgiving Day, 1948. The first MIAA/NSIC meeting in 2000 marked the Mineral Water Bowl's inaugural year of the Division II era. Winona State defeated Missouri Western State, 43-41, in triple overtime, marking the Warriors first-ever postseason win at the Division II level.

The league gears up for the upcoming academic year with the annual NSIC Summer Kickoff Event the last weekend in July. The event includes the NSIC Golf Tournament, Hall of Fame Banquet, officiating clinics and meetings involving the conference leadership. The Northern Sun Showcase television program returns to the airwaves again on Fox Sports Net North. Also, the Northern Sun Spotlight radio show will air on several stations throughout the Midwest for 20 weeks during 2006-07 sports season.

Over the years, the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."
